A Message from FVDG Martin Bonura:

Actions Speak

Anthony Robbins said, "If you talk about it, it's a dream, if you envision it, it's possible, but if you schedule it, it's real." The district has sent each club a request for their membership growth plan. We provided a sample plan with a S.M.A.R.T. goal statement (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic, and Timebound) asking the club to recruit a specific number of new members by June 30, 2025. We suggested holding a membership event or at least one idea the club agrees to accomplish to encourage membership. We provided an action plan with a list of the specific action steps necessary to achieve this goal and a list of those who will be responsible for completing each action step.





The district is asking each club to develop their plan and to implement it. As George Patton said, "A good plan today is better than a perfect plan tomorrow." We ask each club to develop a plan and present it to your club for approval. It may not be the best plan in someone else's eyes, but it is your club's plan and will lead to commitment to recruit new members and a schedule to recruit them. The number of new recruits is measurable, and the schedule provides a target deadline for completing each membership goal in an attainable, realistic and timebound manner.

The district and your Lions club needs to take action to develop and implement your membership plan for your club's sake. Without new members your club will grow, but in the wrong directions. We need to increase membership to keep membership positive. <u>Updates on Lions Vision Research Foundation (LVRF)</u>


