Martin taught in Louisiana public schools, worked as a technician at a chemical plant, was a safety manager at research laboratories in New Orleans and on Plum Island, and as the director of Safety, Quality Control, and Training at the corporate headquarters of a government contractor in Columbia, Maryland.

Martin has the heart of a volunteer and has served as a volunteer fire fighter and hazardous material specialist, and as an emergency medical technician. His focus, dedication, and passion for serving his fellowman led him to become a Lion when the realtor who helped them find a home in Connecticut asked Susan to attend a meeting of the East Haddam Community Lions. Susan became a member of that all- woman Lions club in 1996. Susan asked if a man could become a Lion in that club, and, in 1997, after being interviewed by the club members, they invited Martin to join their club.

After becoming a Lion, Martin realized that his forty years of teaching experience would be extremely useful as a Lion.
