There will be several opportunities to serve at Towson University.

The **Olympics Special /Leo's Unified Sports (Bocce)** event at Towson University will take place from 11:00 am to 4:00 pm. Prior to the event Leos and Lions will create encouragement signs and posters.

There will also be a collection of non-perishable food items to benefit the FoodShare program at Towson University. The FoodShare program provides weekly bags of food to address the needs of students experiencing food insecurity. Students may receive up to 10 items per week when TU is

in session.

Most needed Items to be donated by Lions or Leo Clubs: Tomato Products, Vegetables

(canned), Fruits (Canned or dried), Tuna, Canned Chicken, Beans, Soup, Pasta, Pasta Sauce, Rice/Quinoa, Ramen, Mac & Cheese, Granola Bars, Oatmeal, Snacks (e.g., chips, pretzels, etc.), Peanut Butter, Random Sauces, Cereal, Soap, Bodywash, Deodorant Shampoo/Conditioner, Toothpaste, Toothbrushes, Feminine Hygiene Products Tampons, Pads/Liners, Dish Soap, Laundry Detergent, Toilet Paper



The Children's Inn at NIH

The **Children's Inn at the National Institutes of Health (NIH)** is a nonprofit that provides residential services and a wide range of programs to children, teens, and young adults with rare and serious diseases whose best hope for a diagnosis or treatment is an NIH clinical research study.

Opportunities to serve at the Delta Hotel: Lions, Leos and Guests will be invited to make cards and create Thoughtful Treasures bags. Every child, teen, young adult, and their sibling(s) who are staying at The Inn have their own mailboxes. The residents look forward to the treasures that they receive each day in the mailboxes. **We will also be making Caregiver Bags.**

Most needed Items to be donated by Lions or Leo Clubs: Thoughtful Treasures may be crafted, or store purchased. Some popular treasures include card games, goody bags, seasonal crafts and things to keep children entertained during their treatments.

Guidelines: Treasures should not refer to hospitals, sickness, display a "get-well soon" message or have any religious connotation. For children's safety, items are considered a choking hazard if they can fit through a toilet paper roll. For safety reasons, the following cannot be accepted: used items, stuffed toys, Silly Putty, Play-Doh, balloons, food or candy, or bottles containing liquid. Mailbox

dimensions: 8 inches by 8 inches. Caregiver Supplies: bottled water, sports drinks, tea bags, chewing gum/breath mints, flavored liquid or drink packets (ex: Crystal Light), note cards/pens, puzzles/Sudoku, travel-size toiletries, playing cards, adult coloring books, journals



Tracy's Kids uses Art Therapy to help young cancer patients and their families cope with the emotional stress imposed by the disease and its treatment. The organization's work ranges from individual art therapy sessions with inpatients who may be confined to their rooms, to open studio sessions with outpatients who choose what projects to work on and share their experiences while they receive chemotherapy or other treatment. Tracy's Kids programs are provided free of charge. Masters-trained Art Therapists help kids and families develop strategies for coping with scary procedures, express the fears that might lead to nightmares and social isolation, and communicate with medical personnel.

Opportunities to serve at the Delta Hotel: Lions, Leos, and guests are invited to collect arts supplies for donation to Tracy's Kids.

Most needed Items to be donated by Lions or Leo Clubs: Paint Markers Pens (Acrylic paint), Washable Paint Set Tempera, Paint Brushes, Sketch pads, Drawing paper, Plastic Paint Pallets, Markers, No Spill Paint Cups, Papier Mache Boxes, Washable Dot Markers



Opportunities to serve at the Delta Hotel: Lions, Leos, and Guests are invited to collect school supplies and fill book bags to be donated.

Most needed items to be donated: Pencils, crayons, composition books, markers, dry erase markers, erasers, note cards, glue sticks, filler paper, and book bags



Opportunities to serve at the Delta Hotel: All Lions, Leos, and Guests will be encouraged to recycle materials used during the 100th Anniversary Celebration.

Do you remember the song "Hey Paula"? Well, if you do, do you know who wrote that song?

and he's planning to come to our 100th Anniversary Celebration and possibly sing that song with The Fabulous HubCaps on Saturday evening.

Hildebrand wrote the song "Hey Paula", originally titled "Paul and Paula", taking inspiration from the Annette Funicello hit "Tall Paul". "Hey Paula" is an American pop standard love song recorded by the singing duo Paul & Paula. It hit number one on the *Billboard* Hot 100 on the week ending February 9, 1963, and also made it to number one on the Hot R&B Singles chart. "Paul" was the song's writer, Ray Hildebrand, a student at Texas' Howard Payne University, a Baptist institution in the city of Brownwood.

"Paula" was Jill Jackson, the niece of the owner of the boarding house where Ray lived.

Currently, Ray Hildebrand speaks and sings at churches, prisons, prayer breakfasts and various other occasions. Having lived thru the 50's and the 60's and having had 3 international music careers, he is a walking, talking, icon from that era.
