Happy New Year! C.S. Lewis said, "There are far better things ahead than any we leave behind." Lions Club International believes that one "far better thing" will be the Lion Portal. The Lion Portal is an evolved digital platform coming in 2023.

Currently we access information though our Lion Account, and although the landing page looks unified, MyLion, MyLCI, and Insights all utilize different technological applications. The Lion Portal will combine MyLion, MyLCI and Insights, along with some additional tools and functionality, into a unified experience. The new portal will offer the same features and functionality currently available, but with a more consistent and efficient experience. The Lion Portal is an advancement of the current digital tools. MyLion, MyLCI and Insights won't be available when you log into the new portal. Instead, Lions and Leos will access the various functions performed in those applications directly from the homepage. For example, rather than clicking into MyLion to report your service, you'll access service reporting directly from the main portal page.

The Lion Portal is built on Salesforce, a commercially available platform used by over 150,000 organizations, including 40,000 nonprofits. Salesforce is the recognized industry leader in relationship management systems and will allow Lions a consistent experience with continuous, specific user support and technological support. The new system will also provide Salesforce Shield — an extremely powerful and secure suite of data-privacy and encryption tools. Salesforce will eliminate many of the previous difficulties associated with the current applications. In addition to reporting service, managing club rosters, accessing reports and all the other functionality Lions and Leos currently have through MyLion, MyLCI and Insights, the new Lion Portal will provide a centralized location to access a variety of data and tools. You may remember that Learn is available on the landing page for the Member Portal. Learn will be accessible through the new Lion Portal. So, once you use your new Lion Account credentials to login, you'll click on Learn and it will lead you into the same Learn tool we have today.

Somethings won't change. Lions and Leos will have access to information and functions based upon your position as a Lion and access will be available by desktop, laptop, tablet, or mobile phone, with the same functionality in the Lion Portal.

The Lion Portal is scheduled for a mid-2023 launch but LCI will share more details in the coming months. A preview of the system will be offered prior to the launch. The Lion Portal will include training at launch so Lions can learn while exploring Lion Portal. In addition, LCI will continually be looking to develop training solutions based on the needs of Lions and Leos.

International President Brian Sheehan is asking for your input. Use the QR code to take the technology use survey. This asks about how you use all types of technology at every level of participation; member to leader, to do the work you do in support of our shared mission. At the conclusion of the survey, you can sign-up for informational updates or to participate in focus groups and testing teams.

He was a passionate member of the Lions Club, being a lifetime member for 60 years, initially in Burtonsville and then the Freedom District Lions Club. He held numerous positions throughout his membership with the Lions including President.

He is survived by Jane Wolfe his wife of 63 years, three children, Lorna Wolfe Kaylor and husband John; Deborah Romaine Bigger and husband Keith and Holden Earl Wolfe and wife Karen; grandchildren, Carson and Clairissa Kaylor and Lindsay, Kailey and Miles Wolfe. DISTRICT 22W HONOR ROLL

Attention: All Lions Clubs of District 22W

Please review the following rules for the District 22W Honor Roll

The District 22W Honor Roll Award recognizes Lions who render outstanding service to their clubs and their communities at the "grass roots" level over an extended period of time, who exemplify the spirit of Lionism through unselfish dedication and who deserve District-wide recognition for their efforts in support of Lionism.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Lions who have been members for at least five years are eligible for nomination to the Honor Roll. The current Cabinet Secretary, Cabinet Treasurer and Club Presidents are not eligible and may not be nominated. Past District Governors will become eligible five years after their term as District Governor.

NOMINATION PROCEDURE

Each club may nominate one member per year. In addition, the District Governor may submit two nominations, none of whom may be members of his/her home club. Nominations are to be in writing, signed by the nominee's Club President or Secretary, or the District Governor, and shall list the reasons the nominee is considered deserving of the award by providing a detailed description of the nominee's service and activities in support of Lionism. Nominations are at any time during the Lions year but must be submitted to the 1st Vice District Governor by email or US mail postmarked no later than March 15th at FVDG Jeremy Bair, 199 Warfieldsburg Road, Westminster, MD 21157.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

Award recipients shall be selected from among the nominees by a committee chaired by the First Vice District Governor and consisting of the Second Vice District Governor, Cabinet Secretary, Cabinet Treasurer, and the nominee's Zone Chair. The committee may select up to ten recipients per year. The final selection of the recipients will be based solely on the above eligibility criteria and only what is submitted on the nomination form.

AWARDS PRESENTATION

Honor Roll Award recipients are announced by the First Vice District Governor at the first District business meeting during the Multiple District Convention in Ocean City MD in April. The recipients' name and club shall be inscribed on a master plaque to be updated yearly and shown at convention. Recipients receive a certificate from the District Governor.



- "Something that inspired me was at the end how you told me to never give up and to always follow my dreams, you also said to take a business class when I go into college, and I will definitely consider and look into that."

About the Deep Creek Lake Lions Club and the Blind Skiers Program

Since 1972, the Deep Creek Lake Lions Club has been holding its Blind Skier Program. Over the history of this program, the Club estimates that hundreds of visually impaired children have learned to downhill ski. Each year, the Club typically hosts 3 or 4 groups of visually impaired children and their families for three day sessions from Monday to Wednesday. The Club pays or arranges donation for all expenses for the trips.

At the beginning of each session, the Skiers are set up with equipment and lift tickets provided by Wisp Resort, and are matched up with their volunteer Ski Guides. Barb Law, long-time coordinator for the high-school ski guides, said that the "high-schoolers get an early opportunity in life to experience threwards of service to others." The high school volunteers can also earn service learning hours along with excused absence from school.





The adaptive skiing process usually starts with the Blind Skier standing between two Guides who hold a padded bamboo pole for stability. Skiers who demonstrate the desire and ability to control their speed and direction can graduate to tethered skiing behind a Guide and eventually skiing with a Guide giving directions for turning and stopping. When snow conditions are favorable, the Club provides snowmobile riding to the family groups.

Meals are also an important part of the Program. Volunteers arrive each morning of the Program at the donated lodging to cook breakfast for the skiers, which provides an opportunity for Club members, the Skiers and their families to get to know each other. "While this Program is great for our visually impaired children," said one of the parents, "it's also a respite for our entire family since we can turn our kids loose with the Lions Club and enjoy skiing on our own for a bit."

In the summer, the Club provides the Blind Camp Program, which involves camping, boating, hiking and other outdoor activities. Additional service to the community is provided by the Club through financial assistance to residents for vision-related healthcare, donations to local organizations, and operation of the public park on Bumble Bea Red. Future projects include the building of Garrett County's first all-inclusive playground and the reconstruction of an early 1800's log cabin.
