1. Cinva-ram portable building block presses -- hand operated presses for manufacturing bricks for the construction of schools.

2. Class room aids. Class room supply units including blackboards, paper, pencils, chalk and other writing materials; books in Spanish and physical education kits.

3. Vocational Training Kits to help make the youth of Colombia self-supporting. This included sewing machines, woodworking, electricians, plumbers and other kinds of kits.

Materials were purchased and shipped through "CARE" but distribution was under the supervision of the Lions of Colombia.

With the support of twenty-seven clubs in the district over \$2,600.00 was raised in support of this worthy project. Clubs who attained or exceeded their quota were Lineboro-Manchester, New Market District and Union Bridge. This project in 22-W was under the supervision of Lion Harry E. Filler who served as District Chairman. Lion Harry O. Smith served as Treasurer.

Presidential Merit Award was awarded to Past International Director Massey H. Roe of the Hagerstown Club by Lions International President Dudley L. Simms. Awards by Lions International to Lions included 2 Extension Awards, 1 Master Key and 21 Membership Keys. The 100% District Governors Award was awarded to District Governor Marsh. Two Achievement Award Medals were presented by the Governor.

District Governor Russell H. Marsh served as Secretary-Treasurer of the Council of Governors.

International Counsellor G. Robert Lyles served as Vice Chairman of the 1959 Convention Committee of Multiple District 22, Lions International, held in Atlantic City, New Jersey, May 27-30, 1959.

Deputy District Governor Lawrence A. Dorsey of the Glade Valley Lions Club was elected District Governor for 1959-1960.
