The fifty one clubs in District 22-W had a membership of 2057 Lions as of July 1, 1979. On June 30, 1980 the membership was 2016 in 51 clubs. (Gained Valley Lions Club. Lost Urbana Lions club.)

District 22-W Social was held at the Venice Motel in Hagerstown on October 6, 1979. Past International Director Ralph N. Helm from District 22-D was the guest speaker. Past District Governor Roger E. Moore served as Chairman for the District Social.

During the year 1979-1980 Charters were presented to the following Lioness Clubs: Brunswick, Oldtown, Antietam, New Windsor and Hancock. There are seven officially chartered Lioness Clubs now in District 22-W. Governor Cairl appointed Lioness Marie Byers of the Hagerstown Lioness Club to serve on the Cabinet as Co-Chairman of the Lioness Clubs Committee.

The New Windsor Lions Club organized and sponsored the Valley Lions Club of Pleasant Valley, Maryland. The new Club was chartered with 26 members. The Charter Presentation program was held at the Pleasant Valley Fire Hall on May 13, 1980, the speaker for the evening was Past International Director Ralph N. Helm from Delaware.

There were two Roaring Lions classes held in District 22-W this year. One class was conducted in Region I and the other in Region IV with a total of nine graduates.

The White Cane Day Project successfully raised over \$8,000.00 for the Maryland Eye Bank and other local sight programs.

Contributions from the clubs in District 22-W to Lions International Foundation (LIF) amounted to over \$5,000.00 which exceeded our goal for the year.

The Maryland Eye Bank received the amount of \$14,910.71 from the clubs in our District (excluding the White Cane Day donation). Other sight programs (glasses, examinations, etc.) received contributions amounting to \$9,272.14. There were 30 Eye Clinics held in the District, 25,867 pair of glasses shipped to the needy, 181 pair of glasses purchased and 31 donors signed to donate their eyes.

The Hearing Program received the amount of \$7,071.33 from 33 Lions Clubs and 2 Lioness Clubs in our District, the most of which has been sent to the Maryland School for the Deaf. It will be used to purchase rehabilitation equipment. Thirty Hearing Clinics were held and eleven hearing aids purchased. Our thanks to Past District Governor Murray Ryan for being available when needed and making the results of this effort a proper tribute to Lion A. Laverne Fogle, a dedicated Lion.

Past District Governor Paul Cairl served as Chairman of Multiple District 22 Council of Governors (1979-1980). He was presented with the 100% District Governor Award by the International Association of Lions Clubs.

Deputy District Governor Marion D. Carmack, Jr. of the New Market Lions Club was elected Governor of District 22-W on Friday, May 23, 1980 at the District Convention held at Host Faro, Lancaster, Pennsylvania.

District 22W Social was held at the Venice Motel in Hagerstown on October 4, 1980. Past International Director Joseph L. Wroblewski was the guest speaker. Past District Governor Larry Gerber served as chairman for this event.

During the year 1980-81, an Organizational Certificate was presented to the Gladys Wimert Lioness Club at Westminster, Md. sponsored by the Westminster Lions Club.

The Deep Creek Lake Lions Club sponsored and organized the Friendsville Lions Club of Friendsville, Md. It was chartered on May 23, 1981 with 27 members. The presentation was held at Friendsville Elementary School and the speaker was Past International Director Joe Rabbitt.

Three Leadership Development Seminars were held with approximately 200 future officers attending.

The Lions Clubs International Foundation donations reached the district's goal of \$5,500.00.

The White Cane Day project successfully raised over \$6,500.00 for the Maryland Eye Bank and other sight programs.

Two Roaring Lions classes were held in District 22W, at Freedom District and New Windsor with 8 graduates. Robert Miller represented District 22W at the convention.

The Maryland Eye Bank received contributions of \$16,500.00 (not including White Cane Days). Other eight contributions amounted to **115,000.00**

PDG Marion exceeded his goal of \$15,000.00 This **money was** donated to the Leader Dogs for the Blind School in Rochester, Michigan.

Lion Dale Keefer, Lions Clubs International Foundation Chairman, reported that \$5,300.00 had been collected in District 22-W for this program.

The Sight Conservation Committee, Chaired by Lion Leonard Schwab, and the White Cane Committee, Chaired by Lion Robert Davis, report that the Lion and Lioness Clubs in District 22-W contributed \$28,500.00 to the Maryland Eye Bank. The District sent 17,416 pair of glasses to New Eyes for the Needy, purchased 297 pairs of glasses for the needy, paid for 459 eye examinations and visually screened 500 people.

As of July 1, 1985, District 22 W consisted of 55 Lions Clubs with a membership of 2074 Lions, per Governor Stains report. The year ended June 30, 1986 with a membership of 2046 Lions, a decrease of 28 Lions. (Note: Lions International shows 2049 and 2025 respectfully, a decrease of 24 Lions).

The year started with 13 Lioness Clubs but through the efforts of Lioness' Club Extension-Advisor C.R. Orendorff the Freedom District Lioness Club was added for a total of 14 Lioness Clubs in District 22W. Governor Stains report shows 446 Lionesses as of July 1, 1985 and 502 as of June 30, 1986. an increase of 56 members. The Freedom District Lioness Club was Certified on January 30, 1986.

The District Social was held at the Venice Inn Ballroom, Hagerstown, Md. on October 5, 1985. International Director Larry Emerton was the principal speaker. Past District Governor Roger Moore served as Toastmaster for the evening in place of Special Events Chairman James L. Resh who suddenly passed away a few days prior to the event.

Alcoholism and Drug Awareness Chairman Terry LaRue was active this year in promoting the Lions Quest-Skills for Adolescence Program. Through donations by several Lion and Lioness Clubs three teachers were able to attend the Quest Institute in August for training.

Rev. Frederick Faust, American Heritage and Patriotism Chairman, coordinated the awards night and recognized the winners with flags presented by Delegate Paul Mauldowney. The speaker for the evening was County Commissioner President Ronald Bowers.

The year ended with a total of 492 members in 15 Clubs. (an increase of 42 members for the year)

The District 22 W social, honoring Governor Thomas J. Jefts Jr., was again held at the Venice Inn Ballroom, Hagerstown, Md. on October 4, 1987. International Director George L. "Mick" Burrus was the principal speaker. PDG Roger E. Moore, doing his normal excellent job, served as Toastmaster for the evening.

Alcoholism and Drug Awareness Chairman Lowell Jaclman visited many Clubs and presented the "Quest program". He raised over \$13,000 to further the program. Because of his untiring efforts 1200 students in Garrett and Allegany Counties will learn, during the fall term, to cope with "peer" pressure. Lion Lrnvell's booth at the Multiple District Convention won "first place" this year at Virginia Beach, Va.

As of July 1, 1989, District 22W consisted of 55 Lions Clubs with a membership of 1995 Lions. The year ended June 30, 1988 with a membership of 1994 Lions, an increase of one.
