Deep Creek Lake Lions Club Blind Skier 50th Anniversary Gala Wisp Ski Resort,, Deep Creek, Maryland February 7, 2023

PCC Brian Cox, PCC Robert Muchow, SVDG Susan Cox, PDG Susan Bonura, PCS Martin Bonura, PDG Barbara Brimigion, Zone Chair Leon Cardiff and I attended the Blind Skier Gala. It was a great evening for a worthy event.

Deep Creek Lions Club's mission is to improve the lives of the impaired and local community members, with a special emphasis on outdoor recreation. Since 1973, they have been sharing the fun and challenge of downhill skiing with visually impaired through their Blind Skier program.

In 1970, Bill Thomas, former manager of Wisp Resort, and Jay Kamineck, a ski instructor, were skiing in Aspen Colorado when they saw sighted volunteers assisting young people with vision challenges skiing down a mountainside. They brought the idea back east, helped to found the Deep Creek Lake Lions Club and in 1973, the club held it's first year of the Blind Skier Program Since then, the Club has taught hundreds of visually impaired children to downhill ski. In addition, a similar number of high schoolers have volunteered with the program over the years and have experienced the rewards of community service at an early age.

The evening program consisted of cocktails and appetizers, a silent auction, dinner buffet, a live auction, music, dancing and fireworks. Wisp Ski Resort was decorated like a winter wonderland.

The keynote speaker was Brian McKeever, a Canadian cross-country skier and biathlete. He began skiing at the age of three and started competing at thirteen. He became Canada's most decorated Winter Paralympian when he won his 14th medal at the 2018 Winter Paralympics and finished the 2018 Games with a career total of 13 gold medals and 17 in all making him also the most decorated Paralympic cross country skier ever. Now Brian shares responsibilities for guiding Canada's Paralympic Nordic program on the trails to 2026 and beyond.

Honorees for the evening were Kelly Bingley and Pam Shirmer (Maryland School for the Blind), Wanda Carpenter (volunteer), and Barb Law (High School Volunteer Coordinator).

The event has amazing sponsors and a multitude of volunteers that generously donated their time and talent to make the event a huge success.

The money from donations and fundraising supports housing and feeding the blind skiers and their families at Wisp for the week leading up to the gala, as well as, Deep Creek Lake community service projects.
