

#### OBITUARY FOR LAVALE LION RONALD A. CLITES

LaVale Lion Ronald A. Clites died Sunday, April 16, 2023. Born August 29, 1930, he was 92 years old. He joined LaVale Lions in April 1995. An active member for many years, Lion Ron served his Club on the Convalescent Committee, Greeters Committee, and as Co-chair of the Merchandise Committee. He participated in Club fundraising projects, such as

Christmas tree sales and chicken barbeques. He was a recipient of the Melvin Jones Fellowship in 2011. In recent years, Lion Ron's vision problems prevented him from participating in Club activities, but he remained committed to the spirit of serving others through Lionism. He will be missed.

Lion Ron is survived by his partner of 33 years, Carol McBride, daughter Stephanie Beach, son Michael Clites and several grandchildren and relatives. During his life, he owned and operated Carroll & Clites Engravers and later established Caron East, Inc. He was an active member of the C&O Canal Commission, Urban Renewal Commission and the Juvenile Justice Panel. He served two years active duty in Japan during the Korean War. Lion Ron attended St. John's United Church of Christ in Corriganville, MD. Lion Ron loved traveling, telling jokes, and eating morel mushrooms.

Visitation was held at the Adams Family Funeral Home, Cumberland, MD with burial at the Porter Cemetery, Friday, April 21, 2023. He is predeceased by infant twin sons; 5 brothers and 2 sisters, Thurman Francis, Nelson Francis (Stella), Paul Francis (Shirley), Junior Francis (Geneva), Dollie Francis Leppo (Darrell), Mollie Francis Mooney (Gene) and Dennis Joseph Francis.

Leader Dogs for the Blind empowers people who are blind, visually impaired or deaf-blind with skills for a lifetime of independent travel. All programs are provided free to clients, including equipment, meals and housing during training and travel to and from the Leader Dog campus in Rochester Hills, Michigan.

These free programs are available thanks to the generosity of Lions Clubs throughout the five Western Maryland Counties including Carroll, Frederick, Washington, Allegany and Garrett. Total contributions to Leader Dog from the Lions from these five counties totaled \$22,121.50. Gisela Cooke, a member of the South Carroll Lioness-Lions Club, presented the club's donation of \$200 to Mr. Hawkins, his Leader Dog Dove, and District Governor Nadja Muchow at the May 11th event.

Jeff Hawkins has been among the highest profile representatives of Leader Dogs for the Blind since receiving his first Leader Dog, Gracie, in July of 2012. Despite being diagnosed with an inherited form of juvenile macular degeneration in his early twenties which ultimately caused his blindness, Jeff enjoyed a successful managerial career in the paramedic industry for more than 20 years. During that time, Jeff spent ten years as an Ambulance Operations Coordinator where he directly oversaw a team of 500 employees and sat on several Detroit-area Emergency Medical Services committees, including the Medical Control Board, The Communications and Dispatch Advisory Board, and the EMS Quality Control Committee. Additionally, Jeff worked as a Field Training Officer for many years, taught telemetry and communication at the Paramed EMS Academy, and was the President of the Oakland County EMS Association.

As his vision continued to deteriorate, Jeff realized he needed assistance in maintaining his ability to independently navigate throughout his community and the rest of the country. In 2011, Jeff contacted Leader Dogs for the Blind in Rochester Hills, Michigan to begin Orientation & Mobility (white cane) training. A year later, and after becoming proficient with his white cane, Jeff returned to receive and train with his first Leader Dog Gracie.

Leader Dogs for the Blind was founded in 1939 by three Detroit-area Lions members. Leader Dog programs address individual situations and are adapted to their clients' changing needs at any point in their lives. From youth camp to orientation and mobility cane training through guide dog training and GPS technology integration, Leader Dog's programs give clients the confidence and skills they need to live independent lives. Leader Dog is recognized as a "Best in America" Charity by the Independent Charities of America (ICA).






