I look forward to joining you at the cabinet meeting and zone meetings to begin the process of growing our membership, while retaining our current Lions. What are Leaders? Take a moment to write on a sheet of paper four statements about your skills beginning with "I am a resource for." Write a phrase like, "I am a resource for public speaking," or "I am a resource who can speak Spanish," or "I am a resource as an engineer," or "I am a resource because I can cook." When you have completed your four statements, take a moment to read what you have written.

If everyone in your club did this exercise and you passed the papers around would this be a good way to learn about members and their skills and their passions? You could do this in your club and ask members to circulate around the room; reading other members' paper. This is an active way to learn more about members in your club or district. It is also a great way to learn who are your leaders because leaders are resources.

Leaders are resources who bring skills, knowledge, and talents to each project. Leaders are motivators who inspire, encourage, and influence others to follow or to take leadership roles. Leaders are followers because without followership, leadership is nothing. This means that the key to success in leadership lies in the collective "we," not the individual "I."

Leadership is a process that emerges from the relationship between leaders and followers who are bound together by their understanding that they are members of the same Lions club. Lions are more effective leaders if they are one of us, share our values, concerns and experiences, and are looking to advance the interests of the group. Lion leaders are better served by ensuring that they are seen to be a good follower — as someone willing to work within the club or district.

These leaders use motivation encourages Lions to act. Leaders who motivate yield Lions dedicated to the cause and focused on the task. Lions feel engaged and remain interested. A key characteristic of leadership is to motivate people to achieve common goals. Leaders who are passionate about their work set an example and encourage their team members, driving them todo better. A leader who radiates motivation may promote good morale and encourage Lions to perform well.

What are leaders? They are those Lions who have the following characteristics:

- · Relationships social contacts, they are part of the group, the club
- Involvement actively engaged, stimulated by club service projects
- Ownership to be part of the planning of service projects and fundraising events
- · Comfort free to be themselves and not be judged by their fellow Lions
- Empowerment given authority to make decisions and follow-up on those decisions Personal Growth – to learn or improve skills learning from other Lions
- · Achievement to have successful results and be recognized for their contributions
- · Contribute to have influence in what the club does
- Recognition to be appreciated or rewarded for their merit
- Relevance leadership opportunities, community projects, things that make a
 difference

If you have these characteristics you are a leader.
