I encourage you to attend the Change of Banner Celebration to be held at the Myersville VFD Social Hall on Saturday, July 15th with the Social beginning at 6:00 p.m. We will celebrate IPDG Nadja Muchow and our clubs on a very successful year. We will also welcome District Governor Jeremy Bair with "The Promise of Tomorrow."

The promise of tomorrow from Lions International also includes the new Lion Portal. The Lion Portal promises to be an effective tool that will provide information and opportunities that will now be in one place. Thank you to everyone who participated in the overview training. PCC Brian and I will be attending the International Convention in Boston and I look forward to learning more about the Lion Portal.

The Change of Banner Celebration allows IPDG Nadja the opportunity to recognize the work of both Lions and Clubs, but there is another award that clubs can apply for from Lions International, and that is the Club Excellence Award Download Application 22-23 Applications must be signed by the current district governor and submitted by August 31, 2023. If sent from the district governor's email, it qualifies as her signature on an application submitted electronically.

Upon receiving the award, a banner patch and pin will be awarded to your club president. To qualify for the Club Excellence Award, clubs must meet specific requirements in four categories: Membership, Service, Leadership & Organizational Excellence, and Marketing.

**Membership Requirements**: The club maintained its membership count (closed the year with the same number of members as the start of the year or have a positive membership growth) or chartered a new Lions club, Leo club or Club Branch in the current fiscal year.

**Service Requirements**: The club contributed to LCIF, started a new service project, and three service activities your club participated in were reported in MyLion.

**Leadership & Organizational Excellence Requirements**: The club is in good standing (not in status quo or financial suspension: district dues paid and no unpaid balance with LCI greater than US \$50 outstanding 90 days or more, reported club officers to LCI and key officers participate in club officer training.

Marketing: The club has published its service activities through local media and social media.

Please consider applying for this very special recognition for your club. Reviewing the award criteria can also assist in setting goals for District Governor Jeremy's Lion year. Please let your cabinet officers know if you need assistance in any of these important areas.

2ND VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR MARTIN BONURA

It is said that we Lions have a problem with leadership. Do we?

Some districts do not have a candidate for Second Vice District Governor, some districts need Zone Chairs and Region Chairs, some district committees do not have a Lion in charge and some have a person who is not able to perform the duties of the job. Some clubs have the same officers year after year, or one Lion serving in many positions, or the club has vacant positions.

In our clubs we have officers, fundraiser chairs, service project chairs, and others who lead the various parts of the club's program. In our districts we have a District Governor, Vice District Governors, a Cabinet Secretary, and a Cabinet Treasurer. We have a Global Leadership Chair, Global Membership Chair, and a Global Leadership Chair. We have Zone Chairs and Region Chairs. We have district committees and committee chairs. We need leaders to do all these jobs. You can be one.

Our clubs are populated with Lions who have, or still work in schools, small and large business, and government. Some have created their own companies or firms. Some have organized and managed households. Each Lion has the talents, skills, and knowledge that make them great followers and great leaders.

- · Leaders are resources that bring skills, knowledge, and talents to each project.
- Leaders are motivators that inspire, encourage, and influence others to follow or to take leadership roles.
- Leaders are followers because without followers, leadership is nothing.
- Leaders are servants and a servant leader looks to the needs of the club and other Lions and asks how to help them to solve problems and to develop new skills.

The key to success in Lion leadership lies in the collective "we," not the individual "I." Leadership is a process that appears from the relationship between leaders and followers who are bound together by their understanding that they are members of the same Lions organization. Lions that are the most effective leaders are those who are one of us; sharing our values, concerns and experiences, and are looking to advance the interests of the group. Lion leaders are better served by ensuring that they are a good follower — someone willing to work within the club or district. They are servant leaders.

Servant leadership is a style of leadership where leaders serve others. This is not top-down leadership where leaders get power for their own satisfaction. It is leadership where leaders work with those willing to follow them to ensure the task at hand is accomplished. It is the motto of Lions clubs - "We Serve."

Encouragement is the greatest motivator. A pat on the back. A few words. Empower the people around you by supporting them. Give them the power to achieve and let them show you what they can do. Encourage your fellow Lions to take on new tasks, to explore positions in the club and in the district.

### 2023 LIONS CLUBS ZONE III GOLF TOURNAMENT

For the 22nd year, 6 local Lions Clubs - Deer Park, Freedom District, Greater Carroll, Roaring Run, South Carroll and Taylorsville-Winfield - joined forces to raise funds for three worthy causes by hosting the Region IV Zone 3 Golf Tournament in honor of Past International Director Richard Liebno of Westminster. The causes include the American Diabetes Association, the Lions Vision Research Foundation, Inc. and Abby's Carts of Courage for childhood cancer.

The American Diabetes Association (ADA) provides research, education and advocacy to people throughout the state of Maryland who are affected with diabetes or at risk for developing the disease. The mission of the ADA is to prevent and cure diabetes and to improve the lives of all people affected by diabetes.

The Lions Vision Research Foundation, Inc. (LVRF) supports low vision research and rehabilitation to minimize the disabilities caused by low vision and blindness. The objectives of the LVRF are being met through its partnership with the Lions Vision Research and Rehabilitation Center (LVC) at the Wilmer Eye Institute of The Johns Hopkins Medical Institutions, Baltimore, MD. Abby's Carts of Courage gifts children with cancer a new wagon to help them maneuver through their cancer journey. Often, cancer and its treatment leave patients fatigued and weak. While baby strollers are a great solution, they have a weight limit of 55 pounds making it unsafe for children above that to use. The wagons allow children with cancer to be easily pulled from one place to the next, while allowing them to save their strength for their fight. The wagon is also useful in transporting necessities needed for lengthy inpatient stays. The wagons are more than just a mode of transportation, but a safe place for sitting, reading, painting, or just hanging out during checkups. Filled with items to help keep their mind off their diagnosis and refuel their spirits, these gifts are a true blessing to both the child and their caregivers.

Participation in past tournaments has enabled these Carroll County Lions Clubs to donate \$157,000.00 to LVRF, the ADA and other Lions programs such as hearing preservation.


