FROM THE DESK OF: 1ST VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR SUSAN COX Dear Lions and Leos,

"Unless commitment is made, there are only promises and hopes; but no plans." — Peter F. Drucker

DG Jeremy, GMT Lee Miller, and I have just returned from the USA/Cananda Lions Leadership Forum. We had the opportunity to hear our International President speak on the topic of membership and specifically Mission 1.5. Lions International has created The Global Membership Approach as a four-step process that has been proven to increase both member satisfaction and new member recruitment, as well as new club chartering. The four steps are build a team, build a vision, build a plan and build success.

Build A Team: Build a team of club officers to help support the Global Membership Approach.

Build A Vision: Build a vision, assess needs and set goals.

Build A Plan: Build a plan to achieve our goals.

Build Success: Execute your plan, maintain accountability and adjust as needed.

This month let's consider building a plan to achieve our goals to grow and retain club membership.

Prior to building a plan to increase our membership it is important to conduct a SWOT analysis. Swot stands for strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats. This analysis can be as simple as asking these questions as: what are our club's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats to increasing membership. Once these questions are answered, each club can build a membership goal for DG Jeremy's year. A well-developed goal is specific, measurable, actionable, realistic and time bound. This is a SMART goal. The first step is to write a goal statement, then create action steps to achieve the goal, identify which team members are responsible for assisting in that step, determine the resources needed (team members, technology, funding, etc.,) chose your date to begin and complete each step of the plan. The USA/Canada Forum was held on September 21-23, 2023, in Reno, Nevada. The Forum provided an opportunity for gaining leadership skills with 88 seminars. One of those seminars was facilitated by a Judge from Long Island New York named Anthony Paradiso. You may have heard of him as he is a new International Director who will speak at the 22W social. His topic at the Forum was titled "District Governor/Team - Skills to Succeed". He did a great job at the Forum as he will at the Social. His program was the seed that led to this leadership message.

Leading involves the need for a team. In business or the military you may be assigned a team, allowed to select key members of the team, or allowed to choose the entire team. In our Lions clubs and our Lions districts this also holds true; but more than likely you will be able to select or influence the selection of a majority of your team.

Selecting your team does not mean choosing only your friends or those who agree with you. It should be an opportunity to select those who can, as Andrew Carnegie said, "work together toward a common vision". That common vision is the goal/objective of your club, your district, your multiple, or Lions International. That vision should be something the members of the team have had a say in developing in a way that is meaningful to them.

The vision should not be the desire of one individual or the personal agenda of the 'leader' of the team. Once the team leader understands the vision and the type of individuals they will need to accomplish the task and succeed; they need to identify like-minded Lions or even not-yet-Lions who they will ask to be on the team.

What skills and resources are needed to accomplish the project? Of those you want on the team, who can best provide those skills/resources needed to accomplish the project? The skills could be:

- · Organizational
- Accounting
- Selling
- · Personal interaction
- Planning
- Marketing
- Personal skills such as cooking, construction, legal, training, printing, etc.

The resources could be:

- · A truck
- A building, space, or venue
- A group of volunteers
- · Community connections, etc.

Of those you want on the team, how interested are they in project? How do you get their buy in or how do you increase their motivation to see the project succeed? The leader must sell the vision and offer those who are willing to be on the team the opportunity for input, ideas, and commitment.

The team succeeds when the vision, as modified by the team is accomplished. They cause the success. The team will grow and those on the team will want to take on the next task, maybe leading the next team on the next project. Leadership is about growth of the individual members of the team.

EDISEL KING AUGUST 4, 1933 — SEPTEMBER 11, 2023



With great sadness, we announce the passing of Edisel Delano "Ed" King, a beloved husband, father, grandfather, great-grandfather, dear friend and community member. For decades, Ed's name has been synonymous with Deep Creek Lake. He had a deep love for the lake and everything surrounding it and recently said, "I have never had a bad day at Deep Creek Lake." Ed peacefully departed this world on Monday, September 11, 2023, at the age of 90, in the comfort of his Deep Creek Lake home, where he has been a full-time resident for 39 years.

Born on August 4, 1933, in Hopwood, Pa., Ed was the son of the late Frank A. and Ada (Rankin) King. He grew up in a tight-knit family and from an early age developed a strong work ethic. Ed's dedication to education led him to earn bachelor's degrees from both West Virginia University and Carnegie Mellon University.

Ed's adventurous spirit led him to honorably serve his country as part of the United States Air Force. Stationed at a NATO base in France, he contributed to the defense efforts during a critical period. Following his military service, Ed pursued a successful career as a structural engineer at the American Bridge Division of U.S. Steel in Pittsburgh. Throughout his 28-year tenure, he played a significant role in notable projects across the country, including the iconic PanAm building in New York City, the Chesapeake Bay Bridge and the magnificent New River Gorge Bridge.

In 1984, Ed made the life-changing decision to become a full-time resident of Deep Creek Lake, Md. His passion and love for the area led him to embark on a new journey as a Realtor®, working diligently at Long & Foster Real Estate, Inc. (formerly A&A Realty). Ed's knowledge and commitment to the real estate industry earned him respect from his colleagues and clients alike.

However, Ed's legacy extends beyond his professional accomplishments. He had an unwavering dedication to his beloved community, serving as a 50-year active member and former multi-term president of the Property Owner's Association of Deep Creek Lake and the Deep Creek Lions Club, where he was a member since 1986 and past president As a Lion, he was inducted as a Melvin Jones Fellow, which is the highest award in Lionism and recognizes superlative levels of service to others. Countless people have referred to him as "a legend" around the Deep Creek Lake community. Inspired by his love for the lake, Ed chose to share his wealth of knowledge by authoring several books, including "Famous Boats of Deep Creek Lake," "Deep Creek Lake The Founders," and "I Love Deep Creek Lake." He was diligently working to complete his final book titled "Deep Creek Lake The Founders Book 2", which will be published posthumously. He poured his all into these works as he preserved the memories and history of the lake for future generations to cherish.

Ed's kind and compassionate nature endeared him to all who knew him. He loved trips and visits with his friends and neighbors, all whom he loved dearly. He was known for his generosity, his love of life and his unmistakable "rooster crow," bugle reveille and taps. He touched countless lives through his involvement with various charitable organizations, such as Hospice of Garrett County and the Garrett County Regional Medical Center Foundation. For years, he was a fixture at Hospice's Jail and Bail booth at the county fair. Additionally, Ed dedicated his time and expertise to work with state and local governments on important matters of planning, zoning regulations and lake management.

Ed's memory will be forever cherished by his beloved wife, Lorena "Jean" King, who stood by his side throughout their journey together. He is also survived by his children, Jeffrey King of Kaneohe, Hawaii, Michelle King of Butler, Pa., and Bruce King and his wife Angela of Walnut Cove, N.C. Ed leaves behind several grandchildren and greatgrandchildren, who will always remember him as a loving and devoted patriarch. Additionally, numerous nieces and nephews will remember him fondly.

In addition to his parents, Ed was preceded in death by his brother, J Darwin King, and his sister, Gloria (King) Breakiron.

A memorial service to celebrate the remarkable life of Edisel Delano King, a man who left an indelible mark on the hearts of all who knew him, will be held at St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Oakland at 11 AM on Saturday, October 28, 2023, with Pastor Tom Omholt officiating. Friends, family and community members will be received for one hour prior to the service.

Eugene "Gene" Lee Long, 96, a beloved member of the community, passed away peacefully at his home in Thurmont, MD on September 19, 2023. Born March 1, 1927 near Graceham, MD, he was the sixth of ten children born to the late Franklin and Ruth Troxell Long.

Gene served his country with honor as a member of the U.S. Army during the end of World War II. He returned home with a deep sense of patriotism and gratitude for the freedoms we enjoy. He graduated from the University of MD and began a career in agriculture - managing St. Joseph's College Dairy Farm in Emmitsburg (the current site of the National Fire Academy). As a pitcher and 3rd baseman for the Creagerstown Baseball Club from 1947 - 1957, he was a force with which to be reckoned. He attended seminary in the early '60's but returned to agriculture, retiring as General Manager of Mid-East Dairyherd Improvement Association in 1992.

Gene found great joy in golfing, hunting, gardening, woodworking, playing cards and bowling. He was still playing cards and bowling in a league at age 96. He was a founding booster in the football program at Walkersville High School and was involved in many community projects throughout the years. His signature project was the renovation of the Thurmont Trolley Trail, which was dedicated to the Town of Thurmont in 2007. As the project manager at age 80, Gene along with other community volunteers, transformed a very challenging project into a labor of love that continues to benefit others. His more recent passion was to partner with the National Wild Turkey Federation to provide archery equipment/program for local schools. He always enjoyed helping others often undertaking fundraising challenges for a good cause. He was a member of the Lewistown United Methodist Church and loved his church family.

Gene's dedication extended far beyond his personal pursuits - he deeply valued his relationships with family and friends. He shared a profound love and commitment with his wife Shirley A. Long. In addition to his wife, he is survived by three children: Gloria (Gary) Rollins, Steve (Jane) Long and Janice Long (Steve Insley); eight grandchildren, ten great-granddaughters, one great-grandson and another great-granddaughter on the way. He is also survived by siblings Gloriae Green, Harold (Peggy) Long, Raymond (Naomi) Long, and Carole (Dan) Beauchamp and numerous nieces and nephews. Gene was preceded in death by his parents; his son Davey Long; siblings Franklin Long, Jr., Frances Dreith, Elizabeth Auldridge, Naomi Winifred O'Connor and Blanche Keilholtz as well as several brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law.

Gene always stood tall for what he believed even when it was not the popular opinion. His unconditional love, unwavering strength, sense of humor and quick wit was an inspiration. He touched the lives of many with his generous spirit and infectious laughter. His memory will forever live on in the hearts of those who were fortunate enough to have known him. How blessed we were to have shared life with someone for whom saying goodbye is so difficult!

The family wishes to thank the staff of Frederick Health Hospice for his recent care and Dr. Hegazi and the staff at MD Oncology & Hematology who managed his care for the past two years - allowing him to continue to enjoy life even after his grim diagnosis of Stage 4 Cancer.
