FROM THE DESK OF: 1ST VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR SUSAN COX

Dear Lions and Leos,

"Alone we can do so little; together we can do so much." – Helen Keller

Roar Like A Lion, often abbreviated RLAL, is back for the first time since 2020. AA Rachel Graham and I had the opportunity speak to Region Chairs at our recent cabinet meeting and I have spoken at several Zone Meetings about RLAL. Roar Like A Lion is a community based service opportunity where clubs in a zone or Region come together on a morning or afternoon to provide multiple service projects in one location. Below is additional information about Roar Like A Lion.

Service Projects Guidelines:

- Pick projects for all ages that can be done with just a little guidance if needed, from Lion volunteers. Some projects that have been completed in the past are dog toys, cards for veterans or childhood cancer patients, friendship rocks, friendship bracelets, blessings bags, food pantry snack bags, Linus blankets, scarves and many more.
- · What does your club do that can be easily done by others in a short time frame?
- Do you work with an organization? For example, a nursing home, school, or a food pantry. What needs do they have?
- Ask the library or other location where the event is being held if they have a project, they need help with (cutting out shapes, pics, etc. for children's programs, or such)

Lion Service Project Leaders for each service project:

- A leader or leaders from a club or clubs volunteers to lead a project.
- The Service Project Leader is responsible for estimating cost and getting all needed supplies
- · Determines what directions, tools, materials are needed for the project.
- Consider needs, ask for specific donations for some of the activities from the community, or club members. What can be brought, gathered, donated, etc.
- · Make a sample or two or in stages.
- · Be clear on instructions and set up of the project.
- Determine how it will "flow" assembly line, each person making one, etc.
- · Determine how many Lion helpers are needed.
- · Determine WHAT will be done with the outcome of the project...
- · How/where to deliver to recipients, etc.

General Planning Guidelines for the Day:

- Have an easel with Welcome, list of projects, general flow, info you deem important, that "Photos will be taken"
- LC "Greeters" to point to projects and Lions table, thank folks for coming, etc.
- · Back up projects.... If you run out of planned projects and supplies.
- · Have water bottles for LC volunteers.
- Consider other donation project such as a food drive or collection of items, sneakers, gently used coats, or other items
- Have Lions wear club shirt, vest, nametags

Roar Like A Lion is a wonderful opportunity to work in your community and encourage service for both youth and families. The RLAL Lead Team includes DG Jeremy Bair, FVDG Susan Cox, SVDG Martin Bonura, AA Rachel Graham, Region/Zone Chairs, GLT Specialists. I will be reaching out to Region and Zone Chairs for commitment to the project. Please contact me with any questions you have about Roar Like a Lion.

LEADERSHIP = TRAINING + EXPERIENCE + YOU DECEMBER 2023

Four Lions from our district, District 22-W, joined 20 Lions from all over Maryland, Delaware, and the District of Columbia, Multiple District 22, at Lions Camp Merrick for three days of training at the Regional Lions Leadership Institute (RLLI). They participated in training designed to prepare Lions for leadership positions throughout the organization. Those who attended were Lions ready to pursue leadership roles within their Lions communities.

They reviewed Lions International's history and other fundamentals and discussed local issues and opportunities. They participated in working in teams, setting goals and public speaking. They learned how to prepare a personal mission statement, manage their time, and how to motivate volunteers.

The instructors brought their Lions experience as Lions Certified Instructors, Faculty Development Institute trained instructors, and previous institute instructors. They brought experience as a current International Director and as an International Board Appointee, Past District Governors and as first and second vice district governors. The experience of the instructors included involvement in Roaring Lions, Lions Quest, Marketing, Membership, Leadership, the International Convention and Multiple District Convention, the Lions Vision Research Foundation, the Lions Youth Foundation, the 2027 Convention Host Committee, and many other district, multiple district and international Lions programs.

This leadership opportunity was a Friday, Saturday, and Sunday event that was between three and six hours away from our home district. It also cost \$150 per Lion. What about a training opportunity held in the Myersville Fire Hall training room, 301 Main Street, Myersville, Maryland 21773, on a Saturday from 9:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. with no cost to you or your club?



The Vice District Governor Challenge Between the 2nd and 3rd Cabinet Meeting



The Vice District Governor's challenge will begin on November 12, 2023, for completion by January 13, 2024. We are hosting a food drive for the five food pantries serving Carroll Community College, Frederick Community College, Hagerstown Community College, Allegany College of Maryland, and Garrett College. Local colleges i.e. Frostburg, Hood, etc., are acceptable in this challenge.



For fiscal year 2024 the Maryland Food Bank began charging colleges 50% of the cost for all food ordered and the food pantry has not been funded by the various colleges. All of the food pantries have been struggling to find grants and other sources to keep their pantries stocked with current food items. The challenge is for our Lions to provide non-perishable food items such as canned goods, boxed goods, breakfast items, grab and go meals, snacks and drinks, etc., hygiene products like feminine products, deodorants, body wash, toothpastes and toothbrushes, cleaning supplies, baby supplies, diapers, and paper products (toilet paper, paper towels, etc.). Some clubs may wish to make monetary donations to their food pantry.


Fall Harvest Festival:
