Dear Lions and Leos,

"Do your little bit of good where you are; it's those little bits of good put together that overwhelm the world." Desmond Tutu

Welcome January and welcome 2024, another year with the opportunity to serve our communities and the world. Although we do not serve for awards or recognition, our district provides a very special recognition for Lions who exemplify service to club and community. It is time to nominate those Lions for the District 22W Honor Roll. The District 22W Honor Roll Award recognizes Lions who render outstanding service to their clubs and their communities at the "grass roots" level over an extended period of time, who exemplify the spirit of Lionism through unselfish dedication and who deserve Districtwide recognition for their efforts in support of Lionism.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Lions who have been members for at least five years are eligible for nomination to the Honor Roll. The current Cabinet Secretary, Cabinet Treasurer and Club Presidents are not eligible and may not be nominated. Past District Governors will become eligible five years after their term as District Governor.

NOMINATION PROCEDURE

Each club may nominate one member per year. In addition, the District Governor may submit two nominations, none of whom may be members of his/her home club. Nominations are to be in writing, signed by the nominee's Club President or Secretary, or the District Governor, and shall list the reasons the nominee is considered deserving of the award by providing a detailed description of the nominee's service and activities in support of Lionism. Nominations are at any time during the Lions year but must be submitted to the 1st Vice District Governor by email or US mail postmarked no later than March 15th.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

Award recipients shall be selected from among the nominees by a committee chaired by the First Vice District Governor and consisting of the Second Vice District Governor, Cabinet Secretary, Cabinet Treasurer, and the nominee's Zone Chair. The committee may select up to ten recipients per year. The final selection of the recipients will be based solely on the above eligibility criteria and only what is submitted on the nomination form.

AWARDS PRESENTATION

Honor Roll Award recipients are announced by the First Vice District Governor at the first District business meeting during the Multiple District Convention. The recipients' name and club shall be inscribed on a master plaque to be updated yearly and shown at convention. Recipients receive a certificate from the District Governor.

What does it mean to be a great leader? When we look at individuals in our organization, in politics, our communities, our workplace, or the military we judge their leadership based on actions they take or refrain from taking when problems arise. We may not always agree with their course of action, but accept their leadership based upon how they get things done; their willingness to stand up and make a decision.

Lion leaders perform administrative and ceremonial duties for our club or the district or the multiple district or Lions International. The administrative part of leadership includes preparing the agenda, scheduling events, overseeing fundraising efforts, directing service projects, organizing, and offering guidance.

The ceremonial part of leadership is the easiest and often the most enjoyable. It involves showing up, being recognized, making remarks, honoring deserving Lions, and encouraging involvement. It is easy to be a Lion leader if there are no clashes of ideas, disagreements, or other conflicts; minor or major. All you need to do is arrive, take a seat at the head table, call the meeting to order, and smile while everyone follows a pleasant script. Lion leaders must also work together to reduce conflict and must be ready to make decisions when problems arise.

Decision making is problem solving. As a Lion leader you need to identify potential problems and other areas of conflict. Avoiding conflict by ignoring it never allows you to understand and fix the real problem. When no decision is made it is in reality a decision to ignore the problem and to allow events to determine the outcome. This is never good for a Lions club.

Our Lions world involves listening to and managing the ideas of volunteers who do not need to follow our lead. Their ideas and their approach to fundraising, service and even club management may differ from yours based on their personal plans, their experiences, and their personalities. They are not automatically wrong, just different. However, they may fail to agree with the leader's aims.

A Lion leader listens to determine the concerns of other Lions. The Lion leader identifies problems and if warranted, offers to help. That help always includes paying attention to their concerns, supporting their right to their beliefs and asking what result they are seeking. It does not include immediately taking one side in the dispute over the other.

The Lion leader seeks to find out the root cause of the problem and determine what mutual solution would be to satisfy all sides. Then the Lion leader makes a decision based upon the information available. That decision is the action that we expect from a leader. That action may be to arbitrate or to facilitate a collaboration between the parties, or it may be to assist in another way. Action is the result of the decision and whatever the course of action, the Lion leader reviews it and if necessary modifies it to better serve our Lions.

The Vice District Governor Challenge Between the 2nd and 3rd Cabinet Meeting



The Vice District Governor's challenge will begin on November 12, 2023, for completion by January 13, 2024. We are hosting a food drive for the five food pantries serving Carroll Community College, Frederick Community College, Hagerstown Community College, Allegany College of Maryland, and Garrett College. Local colleges i.e. Frostburg, Hood, etc., are acceptable in this challenge.



For fiscal year 2024 the Maryland Food Bank began charging colleges 50% of the cost for all food ordered and the food pantry has not been funded by the various colleges. All of the food pantries have been struggling to find grants and other sources to keep their pantries stocked with current food items. The challenge is for our Lions to provide non-perishable food items such as canned goods, boxed goods, breakfast items, grab and go meals, snacks and drinks, etc., hygiene products like feminine products, deodorants, body wash, toothpastes and toothbrushes, cleaning supplies, baby supplies, diapers, and paper products (toilet paper, paper towels, etc.). Some clubs may wish to make monetary donations to their food pantry.




