The form may be used by an individual registrant or a couple purchasing tickets or registering together. Please **do not use this form for more than two people**. Forms with more than two names will be returned.

All registrations and orders are to be sent to the Convention Committee Treasurer, IPDG Sue Parks, 8087 Clark Station Road, Severn, MD 21144. Payment must accompany ticket orders.

Hospitality Book - Tickets included in the hospitality book are for the Multiple District Banquet, District Luncheons and the Victory Luncheon. These and individual ticket requests must be received by April 1, 2024.

Tail Twister Sticker - For \$10 per registrant you can order a tail twister sticker to provide exemption from tail twister fines at each event.

Check or Money Order only for the function tickets and tail twister stickers ordered. Orders without payment will be returned. Orders may be grouped and covered by one check (preferably a club check); however, each participant must have an individual registration form. The check should be made payable to MD 22 Convention Committee.
