Let's give Veterans and Active military members, people who have served and continue to serve our country in the military, an opportunity to serve their local communities by offering them an incentive to join a Lions Club. Multiple District 22 will reimburse the \$35 new member entrance or charter fee for a qualifying U.S. Veteran or Active military member when they join a new or existing Lions club in Multiple District 22 between April 7, 2024 and June 30, 2024.



Only honorably discharged U.S. Veterans and Active military members who served or currently serve in the Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, National Guard, Navy, or Reserves are eligible for this program. Veterans and Active military members must provide proof of military service by providing one of the following documents: DD Form 214, State or County Veterans ID Card, Dept. of Veterans Affairs ID Card, State Driver's license designating veterans' status, VFW membership card, American Legion membership card, or Active military ID.

Clubs seeking reimbursement must complete and submit a *MD22 Veterans/Active Military Membership Certification Form*. This form is available from your District Governor. The completed form must be received by the MD22 Council Treasurer, DG John Mosier, no later than June 30, 2024 to be considered for reimbursement. Please contact your District Governor if you have any questions.

Outline of the MD22 Veterans/Active Military Membership Promotion Initiative

- Multiple District 22 will reimburse the \$35 new member entrance or charter fee for a qualifying U.S. Veteran or Active military member when they join a new or existing Lions club in Multiple District 22 between April 7, 2024 and June 30, 2024.
- The COG has approved \$5,000 for this program which will cover the entrance or charter fee for up to 142 new Veteran and Active military members throughout MD22.
- Only honorably discharged U.S. Veterans and Active military members who served or currently serve in the Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, National Guard, or Reserves are eligible for this program.
- Veterans and Active military members must provide proof of military service by providing one of the following documents: DD Form 214, State or County Veterans ID Card, Dept. of Veterans Affairs ID Card, State Driver's license designating veterans' status, VFW membership card, American Legion membership card, or Active military ID.
- The \$35 entrance or charter fee will be reimbursed to the new member's club. No checks will be issued to new members.
- Clubs must complete and submit the *MD22 Veterans/Active Military Membership Certification Form*. The completed form is to be mailed or emailed to DG John Mosier.
- If the new member qualifies for reimbursement, DG John will send a check to the club contact person listed on the form.
- All requests for reimbursement must be received no later than June 30, 2024. No checks can be issued after that date.

2024 NATIONAL MEMORIAL DAY PARADE FACT SHEET

- The National Memorial Day Parade is on Monday, May 27, 2024, in Washington, DC and is sponsored by the American Veterans Center.
- Lions Clubs of Multiple District 22 (Maryland, Delaware and Washington, DC) and Multiple District 24 (Virginia) are participating again as a Three-Star Sponsor, with a float. Lions have walked down Constitution Avenue the past 15 years displaying their club Banner and showing support for our armed services members. (2020 the Parade was virtual and in 2021 we did a hybrid version. This was necessitated because of the COVID outbreak).
- We are asking clubs to recruit for more participation this year. Remember, LEO Clubs are encouraged to participate in this event. We would like to see more participation than last year, *come show your pride.*
- Your club can also participate by providing financial support to supplement the grant money received from LCI. The money can come out of either your activities account or administrative account. A suggested amount is \$50 to \$100 per club, but any amount will be a great help. Checks should be made out to: "Lions NMDP" and mailed to: Treasurer Mike Yuenger, 12597 Fascia Court, Woodbridge, VA, 22192. **Donations are not a requirement for participation in the parade, come out and enjoy.**
- Your Club or Organization can also donate snack items, sports drinks or water which will be provided to the participants at the site.
- Uniform of the Day – Special yellow T-Shirts and dark pants, shorts or skirts for all and patriotic sashes for Veterans. LEOs may also wear LEO Shirts. If you participated in the past, you can use the same yellow tee shirt or you can purchase a new shirt, sizes Small to 3X Large for \$15.00. We have a few 4X Large on hand, but if you need 4XL or 5XL, let us know well in advance so we can special order for you. Special order will take about 3 weeks at minimum.
- The Registration Venue - District 22C LCOF Trailer will be on 7th Street near Constitution Ave. N. W. from 10:00am until 5 pm. Registration will start at 11 am.

After registration, participants are free to visit the many tourist venues in the vicinity or enjoy visits with other Lions or other parade participants. All participants should assemble in the staging area 30 minutes before step-off. Step-off time is approximately 2:00PM.

Plan your arrival time based on the weather and your interest in exploring the museums and monuments

- Transportation to DC: The Lions staging area is near 7th Street & Constitution Avenue N. W. Since parking is severely limited on this day, **you are advised to take the Metro to Navy Memorial/Archives Station.**
- Veterans – Please indicate your branch of service when registering. Registration form are being sent separately.
- There is a Participant Waiver Form which must be completed by everyone participating in the parade. This is a requirement, and there will be forms at the registration site. Please check in so we know who is participating.

- Please indicate if you can't walk one mile in summer heat conditions (10 blocks down Constitution Avenue). You will be placed on the float riders list, first come, first serve.
- If you plan to bring your Club Banner and have marched before, please bring the PVC holders if you have them. There is only a limited number of these available on the LCOF Trailer.
- There will be snacks and refreshments and plenty of water provided.
- End of Parade Transportation – If you wish, you will be transported by bus back to 7th Street & Constitution Avenue after the parade. Bus also stops at various Metro Stations. You will be given instructions as to where buses will be located at the parade's end. Vehicular traffic is severely restricted during this period, so please listen carefully to the coordinator. We will Endeavor to make this as easy as we can. We have tentative plans to load at 19th and Virginia. This will be contingent on how we are able to navigate with the roadblocks.
- End of Parade Celebration will be at home of PDG Woody Woodard. The Home address is: 8417 Chillum Ct, Springfield, VA 22153. Directions and parking instructions will be handed out at the site. Please plan to come and celebrate a job well done. Those that have been there before should know the routine, and we look forward to seeing you again and hope it turns out to be a joyous occasion.
- *Metro Station at Springfield-Franconia is closest to my home, so you can factor that into your travel plans as well.
- If you are bringing a bus, let me know and I will get parking information. It is usually somewhere around 18th & Virginia near the parade end.

2024 NATIONAL MEMORIAL DAY PARADE AGREEMENT OF RELEASE

I, the undersigned, will appear/participate in the 2024 National Memorial Day Parade on **Monday, May 27th, 2024** (the "Parade"). The Parade is being given as a public service.

I assume any and all risks associated with participating in the Parade and particular activities that I agree to undertake, including but not limited to, negligent or reckless acts by other participants and volunteers, all such risks being known and appreciated by me. I also agree to abide by the rules of the Parade as set forth by designated officials, producers, and supervisors.

Knowing these facts, and in consideration for being permitted to participate in the Parade, I hereby, for myself, my heirs, executors, administrators, successors, assigns, or anyone else who might claim on my behalf, covenant not to sue, and waive release and discharge the American Veterans Center, The District of Columbia, The National Park Service, JM Best Entertainment Inc., Under the Sun Productions Inc., Music Celebrations International, any and all parade sponsors, and each of them, their officials, agents, each of their parent, affiliated, subsidiary and successor entities, and their respective officers, directors, shareholders, members, agents, representatives and employees and any and all Parade sponsors, and each of their officials, agents, designated event supervisory personnel or anyone acting for or on their behalf (the "Releasees"), from any and all losses, costs (including without limitation, litigation costs, and attorney fees), claims, damages, suits, actions, demands, liability, and expenses in connection with loss of life, personal injury and/or property damage of any kind whatsoever, in law or in equity, arising out of or in the course of my participation in the Parade.

In consideration of possibly broadcasting my performance/appearance in or pertaining to the Parade, or in connection with the promotion of the Parade, I grant to American Veterans Center the irrevocable right to use, record, broadcast, and distribute and to license and authorize others to use, record, broadcast and distribute, without further obligation or payment to me or my family, my name, voice, likeness, performance and/or statements for any and all purposes at any time in any and all media now known or later developed, including without limitation exploitation by all forms of television (including but not limited to broadcast, cable, and other television type systems), radio, print and print media, videotape, audiotape, the Internet, on-line services and other telecommunications, wire, and/or computer drive media. Clips provided that any such broadcast will be solely for purposes of promoting the Parade. I waive any rights I may have to inspect and/or approve any and all such uses. I understand that nothing in this release shall obligate American Veterans Center to use my performance in any program or media.

I understand that the Parade is being given for the entertainment of children and the public, and no consideration is being paid to me.

I also agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the Releasees from and against any and all claims, losses, costs, fess, (including but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees) by whomever or wherever presented, including but not limited to, personal injury, property damage, financial loss, wrongful death or any other loss or injury resulting in any manner from my participation in or pertaining to the Parade.

American Veterans Center, Under the Sun Productions, Inc., JM Best Entertainment, Inc. and its affiliates are not responsible or liable for any COVID-19 related complications or death of any performer, spectator, or employee. Both parties of this agreement agree to follow and abide by all Covid-19 procedures and guidelines.

I acknowledge that I have read the foregoing release and indemnification, am executing it knowingly, voluntarily, willingly, and free from any coercion or duress, and am fully aware of its contents and legal effects. I agree to abide by all of its terms.

HEALTH REGULATIONS:

You must obtain a Carroll County Health Department Temporary Food Service Facility License. The license must be posted during the entire event. **Necessary paperwork is attached and must be completed and returned to the 4 County Lion's Club no later than May 20th, 2023.** Temporary Licenses are obtained from the Health Department by the 4 County Lion's Club and vendors should not send or drop off any forms directly with the Department.

EVENT OPERATION:

As the Vendor, you are responsible to provide your canopy, tables, chairs, table coverings and ice. You are required to bring your own signage. Fire regulations require that you bring a fire extinguisher if you use Sterno, Butane, Propane, Electric or Charcoal grills.

Food vendors may not sell alcoholic beverages.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

Exhibit space, table covers, and backdrops must be appropriate, uncluttered, and not offensive to adjacent exhibit spaces. All excess inventories must be stored out of sight.

Exhibitor will comply with all rules of the 4 County Lion's committee.

Exhibitor will be allowed to sell Ice Tea and Lemonade only
NO OTHER BEVERAGES PERMITTED!!!!

Please be prepared to set up through the week by 5PM. Store most of your food preparation items and products in your space area and or the walk in provided at grounds.

Food booths must stay open and operational during the event hours. Booths cannot be broken down or vacated prior to the closing time.

All displays shall be kept neat and clean with the Vendor responsible for clean-up at the end of the event by removing equipment, inventory and improvements, and leaving the exhibit space in the same condition as on arrival. The Vendor shall be liable for delivery, handling, set-up and removal of its own displays and materials.

The Vendor shall conduct business in accordance with all laws and highest standards of business ethics.

Nothing shall be nailed, stapled or otherwise fixed to structures or the grounds.

NO PETS ALLOWED

The Vendor must comply with all Health Department Regulations. **The Health Department paperwork and vendor application must be sent directly to the 4 County Lion's Club NOT to the Health Department.**

The Vendor shall be substantially present at the exhibit space for the duration of the show hours and shall have qualified, experienced and responsible staff available at all times.

The 4 County Lion's Club committee reserves the right to ask a Vendor to leave when, in its opinion, the Vendor is found to be disruptive to the event, other Vendors, or customers; the Vendor forfeits the exhibit fee.

The Vendor shall not increase prices once the event opens to the public.

The Vendor shall obey all fire regulations and County, State and other applicable laws.

The Vendor shall not consume nor permit his/her staff to consume, alcoholic beverages in the food service area or while vendor/staff are participating at the event.

The 4 County Lion's committee reserves the right to establish such additional rules and regulations as it deems necessary for the safe and successful operation of the event.

PLEASE NOTE:

A walk-through will be done **PRIOR TO AND DURING** the event.

CARROLL COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT GUIDELINES

The following are minimum requirements.

Hand-wash facilities are required for operations that handle food products, which are not individually pre-packaged or pre-wrapped. (Example: pizza, hot dogs, hamburgers, sandwiches, etc.) A non-toxic, easily cleanable water dispenser with potable water must be used for hand washing with a basin to collect wastewater. (Example: plastic or non-toxic metal is acceptable.) Soap, paper towels, and a trash receptacle must be provided. Please note that hand-washing facilities and dishwashing facilities must be separate. Hand washing must occur before and between glove uses. Hands must be washed for a minimum of 20 seconds.

Glove use is required by any person handling ready to eat foods. No bare hand contact is allowed. Gloves must be changed when going from raw food to ready to serve foods; if gloves become damaged; and after a period of continued use.

Washing facilities for utensils, pots, pans, etc. are required for those operations which handle food not individually pre-packaged or pre-wrapped and require utensils for serving or equipment for cooking. Three adequately sized, easily cleanable, containers filled with potable water are to be used. Example: plastic or non-toxic metal is acceptable. The first basin is to contain soap and water. The second basin is to contain clear rinse water. The third basin is to contain clear rinse water with the proper concentration of sanitizing agent poured into the water (Example: 1/4-oz. of bleach per gallon of water). These basins should be emptied and replenished as needed.

Each stand must have a cooler or other acceptable means of refrigeration to keep potentially hazardous foods at 41° Fahrenheit or below. Example: hamburgers, hot dogs, pizza, cream-filled pastries, custard pastries, etc. Each cooler or refrigeration unit must be provided with a thermometer to check the temperature. An adequate supply of ice or ice packs may be used in the coolers. However, food must not be placed so it can be flooded by melted ice. All raw foods must be stored separately from ready-to-eat foods.

Any foods requiring heating shall be rapidly heated to these minimum temperatures:

- Measure the temperature at center of the food.
- Shell Eggs 145°F hold for 15 seconds
- Roast Beef 145°F hold for 15 seconds
- Pork & Ham 155°F hold for 15 seconds
- Poultry 165°F hold for 15 seconds
- Stuffed Meat 165°F hold for 15 seconds
- Ground Beef & Comminated Meats 155°F hold for 15 seconds
- All others 145°F hold for 15 seconds
- Reheat Leftover Food 165°F
- Hot Hold for All Foods 155°F minimum
- When cooling, food shall be rapidly cooled under refrigeration or ice bath and stored at 45° Fahrenheit or less.

All stands preparing food must have calibrated food thermometer on-site and available at all times.

All foods are to be wrapped or covered to protect them from contamination by dust, dirt, sneezing, coughing, unnecessary handling by the consumer, and all other sources of contamination, during storage, preparation, display, and service.

All food and food contact items must be elevated off the floor or ground.

Equipment shall not have cracks or crevices and shall be made of nonporous, non-toxic material. It shall also be free from dirt, corrosion, chipping paint, and shall be in a general state of good repair. Equipment shall also be easily cleanable. Plastic, which is cracked, metal, which is rusted or pitted, and chipped enamelware should not be used. All stands preparing foods must have overhead protection (tent or canopy) as well as an approved ground cover. Examples of approved ground cover include concrete, asphalt, plastic tarps, and other non-porous cleanable surfaces.

All Special Food Service Facility Events are subject to inspection by the Health Department.
