

A Message from FVDG Martin Bonura:

Where are we? Such a simple question to ask, but one that should be asked often. As Lions we know that we have completed four months of this Lions year. We know that we had great ideas and some plans for growing our club, conducting service projects and fundraisers, and for having great joy for service.

The question is important because we are often overcome by unexpected events, by setbacks, or by life that distracts us from our goals. We each need to take the time to see if we are taking the actions necessary to grow our club, to conduct the service projects we want, to participate in the fundraising the club needs, and to have fun.



Our clubs are taking the actions needed to grow. Clubs have improved Lion satisfaction, held membership events, provided Lions at service projects and fundraising events to encourage membership to their clubs, and have spoken to friends and family inviting them to join them in service. The district is working on growing membership by using LionsMap2Grow https://chatgpt.com/and-LionsMarket2Grow https://chatgpt.com/g/g-Ft6guiuAC-lionsmarket2grow both found at https://www.lionsvirtual.org/

We are using these artificial intelligence tools to identify areas in the district for potential new clubs or replacement clubs for those that no longer exist. These tools have identified areas of Frederick and Washington counties for extension. These tools recommended that we develop partnerships with local libraries, the local chamber of commerce, local medical services, local governments, and other non-profits. We have plans to attract young professionals and retirees; anyone with a passion for service that need to be acted upon.

Our clubs are taking the actions needed to provide service to meet community needs. We provided sheets, pillows, bed sets, and comforters to Sleep in Heavenly Peace, while some clubs helped to build the beds. Some are still helping. The Francis Scott Key Club in Frederick sponsored Canines on the Creek to provide a fun event for the community and to raise funds for Leader Dog. The Deep Creek Lions are preparing for Blind Skiers this winter and are helping to raise funds for an inclusive playground.

The district is working on our multi-club Roar Like a Lion service project where multiple clubs work with their communities' young students to perform meaningful service. The students make cards for veterans, Linus blankets, thank you bags, flag stands, and other crafts while earning service hours. The Lions, and any potential Lions they invite to participate in these service projects, guide the youth, encourage them, and ensure the items created receive a good home.

Many of our clubs are raising funds needed to meet community needs. LaVale has held its chicken BBQ and clubs have held their basket, Polish Pottery, or cash bingos. Raffles are being held, football pools are being conducted, as are sales of all kinds. The district assisted the Silver Run Lions in the corn roast at the Union Mills Homestead.

Our Governor's theme is the Joy of Service and we each know how our service impacts us. Look at what you are doing and see what actions are needed to make your goals a reality. It is a joyful experience to see a plan come together.

From the Desk of Lion Michelle Miller, Peace Poster Chair:



This poster represents the theme "Peace WIthout Limits" by showing an appearing "limitless' display of peace, despite what lies on the opposite side of the curtain, with diverse people holding hands to the succession of human-made landmarks, and every incorporation of united life inbetween. Peace appears to run abundant and eternal on this side of the curtain. However, on the left side, of which the boy appears to be 'coming from', war is imminent. With fires, destroyed buildings, battle, and death, this side depicts the depression and loss which is projected from war. Between having the 'graves' of religion side by side, a grieving mother, and a starving dog, the feeling of hopelessness is looming over the whole scene. A smaller detail of modern incorporation of war is that of the 'curtain cloth of countries' having the flags of countries that are currently in or suffering the effects of war facing that side, and being scathed in the crossfire. By having a mere child be the one who "pulls back the curtain", this art shows how not even the most young and innocent are spared from war and hate, while paradoxically showing that they can make the biggest difference of all.



Update on the 1st VDG Service Challenge:

Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP) is a non-profit organization that builds and delivers beds to children and families in need. They believe that a bed is the basic need for a child's physical, emotional and mental health. The organization was founded in 2012 in Twin Falls, Idaho. There are 325 chapters nationwide. There are 6 chapters in Maryland: Hagerstown, Frederick County, Hartford County, Howard County, Montgomery County and St. Mary's County.

Preliminary List of Participating Lions Clubs: Boonsboro, Brunswick, Chewsville, Deer Park, Frederick Fusion, Freedom District, FSK, Glade Valley, Grantsville, Greater Carroll, Hagerstown, Hampstead, Kitzmiller, Hancock Lioness-Lions, LaVale, Libertytown-Unionville, Lineboro-Manchester, Middletown, Myersville, New Market, New Windsor, Oakland-Mountain Lake Park, Roaring Run, Smithsburg, South Carroll Lioness Lions, Taylorville-Winfield, Terra Rubra, Thurmont, Union Bridge, and Westminster.

FVDG Martin Bonura reported that our clubs donated about \$2,000 to SHP and enough bedding to cover 180 beds for children in Frederick and Washington counties.

Update on the 22W Mobile Screening Unit:

The Mobile Screening Unit will be delivered in November and then we will have to get it wrapped (graphics), equipped, policies and procedures finalized, etc. It will probably be late spring of 2025 before it will actually be placed in service. It will be available to all clubs in 22-W through a booking procedure (still being finalized) for conducting basic health screening services at public events, etc. Final package of screening capabilities still being developed - advances in technology may result in additional screenings being added beyond the original vision, BP / Pulse / blood oxygen level, hearing, and blood glucose proposal. We will only screen and recommend further medical tests - not diagnose.

The Mobile Screening Unit Advisory committee will provide training to clubs, but clubs will be responsible for staffing the unit at their events. There will be designated drivers from around the district who will move the unit from location to location.

They changed the shelf above the driver due to lack of head room. Instead, they added a TV mount above the driver and outlet in case you wanted to use the TV inside. So the tv can be mounted on the inside above the driver or outside. They also added storage compartments above the passenger and driver.














Highlights from the LVRF VISION FEST RALLY:







Guest Speaker on Zoom: a Civil Rights Lawyer and Federal Judge Tatel (right) who retired from the bench earlier this year, after having spent 30 years on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit. He shared the challenges of living and working with a disability (genetic condition called retinitis pigmentosa which was diagnosed at the age of 15) by first denying his blindness and wouldn't talk about it for 60 years before accepting it with the help of his guide dog and the current technology on computers and smartphones which can create emails, read emails aloud to him, read aloud the news articles from websites etc so he can be more independent and doesn't have to rely on his family as much.





LVRF Chair Evan Gillett was the MC who introduced our Lion guests such as PIDs Dick Liebno, Ted Reiver & Joe Gaffigan and ID John Lawrence as well as Wilmer guests Dr. Judy Goldstein who was awarded a Melvin Jones Award (right) and Lion Dr. Gislin Dagnelie (see bottom right).



District 22W Aim for Sight LVRF Fundraiser at Mayberry on October 12th raised over \$5,000 for LVRF.



Emergency Grants provide up to US\$10,000 for districts impacted by a natural disaster. Lions' district governors may apply for Emergency Grants to help meet immediate needs such as food, water, clothing, and medical supplies. LCIF awards nearly US\$2 million in emergency grant funding each year.

LCIF Disaster Relief Grant News: As of September 1, 2024, any expenses previously covered under the Community Recovery Grant can now be funded through LCIF's Emergency Grant program. The Emergency Grants will continue to support Lions in disaster-affected areas by providing assistance for immediate and short-term recovery efforts. We appreciate the impact that Community Recovery Grants have made, and we look forward to seeing how Lions continue their vital work through the Emergency Grants program.

LYF Fundraiser sponsored by the Terra Rubra Lions Club:

On November 16th, Terra Rubra Lions Club conducted their annual LYF fundraiser at their Lions Building as they have done for many years. For \$15, the attendees had a delicious meal of fried chicken, hot dogs & kraut, chips, pickles, soft drinks, beer, and dessert. There were 31 drawings for cash prizes up to the \$500 Grand Prize;



total guaranteed cash payout was \$1500. There were small games of chance, raffles, and a 50/50 drawing. There were about **145** attendees with attendees from the following 22W clubs: Chewsville, Deer Park, Freedom District, Glade Valley, Harney, Libertytown-Unionville, Lineboro-Manchester, Middletown, New Windsor, Roaring Run, SC Lioness-Lions, Taneytown, Taylorsville-Winfield, Terra Rubra, and Thurmont. The attendance was much better than last year when they had about 100 attendees. This fundraiser raised **\$7100.00** for LYF which is celebrating 20 years of service. The Harney Lions Club donated \$565.00 back to the foundation. Most of the winners donated their winnings back to the foundation. LYF Treasurer Gary Buchman reported that between October 2021 and June 2024, 9 grants had been given out by the foundation. The following clubs in District 22W have received LYF grants since 2021: Hagerstown (2), Libertytown-Unionville (1), Thurmont (1) and Roaring Run (1).

What is the Kusiak Lions Youth Foundation?

It is commonly referred to the "Lions Youth Foundation". The mission of the foundation is to empower young people to help themselves and others through activities supported by the Lions Clubs of Maryland, Delaware and the District of Columbia and their communities.

The purpose of the foundation is manifold. They are to:

- Promote public awareness and support of the Foundation and its mission.
- Provide funding and services for results-oriented youth development initiatives.
- Recognize leadership in volunteer participation and financial support for youth development objectives.
- Encourage high standards in community youth services.

The objectives of the Foundation are to:

Develop, establish, promote and maintain a program of youth services to Multiple District through Lions Clubs of Multiple District 22.

Provide a responsible organization accountable for the administration of the finances of the Foundation for the purposes and objectives herein defined in order to achieve our stated mission.

Receive gifts, donations and legacies from any source approved by the Board, distribute them equitably or invest them wisely and use the earned income to accomplish the mission of youth service projects.

Make grants, gifts, loans and appropriations from its current operating budget and unrestricted monies in accomplishing the objectives and purposes of Lions Clubs International in the field of youth services.

To establish, administer and develop an Endowment Trust Fund that is large enough to underwrite the Foundation's annual operating budget and its service program.

To purchase, take, buy, hold, mortgage or otherwise lien real and/or personal property, and give, lease, sell, exchange, convey, transfer, or in any manner dispose of real and/or personal property of the Multiple District, for the purpose of generating revenue for the Foundation.

To encourage service-minded people to serve on youth service projects in their respective communities without personal

financial compensation.

Report on the Board of Directors Meeting October 12 – 16, 2024 Natal, Brazil

The Board of Directors Meeting was held in Natal, Brazil near the home of our International President, Fabricio Olivera. Natal is on the northeast corner of Brazil and during World War II had a large US Army Air Force base since it is the closest location in the Americas to Africa. Natal is a beach town and a great location for our meeting.

The opening session was on 12 October, committee meetings on 13 – 15 October, and the final session on 16 October. The results of the committee discussion will be presented by LCI at a later date, but here are some of the highlights. One of the biggest items came from the Convention Committee with the news that the convention next summer has been changed from Mexico City to Orlando, Florida. Mexico City was unable to fulfil its agreed upon obligations including rates for hotels, parade route, and costs for the venue. Fortunately, the Lions of Orlando were in the process of submitting a bid for a future date and were able to speed up their operation to obtain the needed sites. The convention will begin a bit later in July than usual with registration on Sunday, 13 July 2025, The parade will be on Monday and the plenary sessions on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday.

The LCIF Executive Committee reported on several items.

The Lions Quest curriculum and materials have been revised for the elementary and middle schools and work is ongoing to rewrite the material for high schools. The committee reported that 521 LCIF grants totaling \$15,386,999 have been awarded so far this year including a community impact grant to District 22-W for Kits for Elementary School Children. Last year Lions raised 107% of our stretch goal of \$70,000,000 and so far this year we have raised over \$8,500,00 or 11 % of our stretch goal of \$80,000,000.

The Marketing Committee awarded a total of \$500,000 in Marketing Grants including the request from MD-22.

The Membership Development Committee received reports from the Membership Summits around the world to include those held in Chicago and Orlando. They were well received, the enthusiasm of the participants was high, and many District goals for club and membership growth were raised. It was suggested that the summits could be held earlier in the year starting as early as mid-May.

Mission 1.5 was a common theme in all the committee meetings. For the year 2023 – 2024, we experienced a loss in membership of just over 3,000 Lions. However, this was an improvement from the loss in the previous year of over 33,000 Lions. All Lions are encouraged to ask their friends, families, and acquaintances to become members. The most significant growth has come from new clubs. In particular, Specialty Clubs have been formed in many areas. Where there is a group performing service to their community, let them know about the advantages of becoming a Lions Specialty Club.

While the Board of Directors were in meetings, their Partners in Service were taken to various cultural sites and to service activities. In particular, on one day they packed food bags to be distributed later to cancer families and patients. Each family was given bags of food that weigh about 30lbs. The companions then went to a Cancer Hospital and observed the radiation and chemo unit where 134 patients a day are being treated. The Partners in Service served tea, juices, milk, crackers, and cake to families and patients in the crowded waiting area.

After the board meeting, many of the directors and staff went to a nearby town of Joao Pessoa for a service week. One of the service activities was doing a beach clean-up in a heavily used beach area on the Atlantic Ocean. Another activity was assisting at a children's eye screening at the local eye hospital. While the screening was taking place, we provided food bags for the families, snacks and drinks for the children, and dental kits. A local dentist was also present to help with tooth cleaning and dental hygiene.

The Host Committees at both Natal and Joao Pessoa were very hospitable, friendly, and helpful. Many friendships were strengthened and new friendships made. This Board Meeting will not soon be forgotten.
