DG Susan Cox's Monthly Message:

Dear Lions and Leos,

"Life's most persistent and urgent question is, 'What are you doing for others?" — Martin Luther King Jr. As we begin a new year, this powerful question challenges us to reflect on our commitment to serving others and inspires us to act. The New Year brings opportunities to renew our dedication, expand our impact, and find joy in serving those in need. Below is an update on the state of District 22W.

Membership Growth & Retention

Membership growth and retention are key to sustaining the district and enabling Lions and Leos to serve our communities. This Lions year, we've welcomed 54 new members, but we've also dropped 85 members, resulting in a net loss of 31 members, including 20 due to death.

Currently, 12 out of 50 clubs have active membership growth plans. I urge all clubs to prioritize retention and recruitment, utilizing resources like Lions Map2Grow to support revitalization. Our Mission 1.5 initiative aims to form two new clubs, beginning with one in the Urbana, Frederick County area. Let's work together to grow our Lions family.

Service Projects & Impact

Service is the heart of our organization. 31 Lions Clubs and 3 Leo Clubs have already reported their activities. If your club hasn't yet submitted reports, please reach out for assistance. I'm grateful to GST Coordinator Bonnie Gillett for leading initiatives like Roar Like a Lion for Regions III and IV. I encourage all clubs to consider new service projects that address unmet community needs. The next few months are a perfect time to launch initiatives that bring hope and support to those we serve.

Club Excellence & Achievement

Earning the Club Excellence Award is a meaningful way to recognize your club's dedication and achievements. There's still time to meet the criteria and set your club on the path to excellence by year-end.

Fundraising & Financial Health

Our district has shown incredible generosity, donating \$44,610 to the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) so far. Contributions from 33 clubs and 98 members have brought us to 93% of our goal. I'm confident we'll reach 100% with your continued support.

Support for Health Initiatives

As we honor Melvin Jones' birthday, Lions USA invites us to participate in vision screenings during the week of January 12-19, 2025. This initiative is a meaningful way to serve our communities while celebrating our founder's legacy. Please refer to the Weekly Announcements for details.



A Message from FVDG Martin Bonura:

Action for the New Year January Newsletter Article

One-quarter of a century ago we were told that our computer systems could potentially fail due to potential computer errors related to the formatting and storage of calendar data for dates in the 1900's after the year 2000. Many programs represented the four-digit year with only the final two digits. This inability to distinguish dates correctly had the potential to bring down worldwide



infrastructures for computer reliant industries of the time. The year 2000 computer problem was labeled "Y2K". It was a time for action and preparations to prevent the chaos that some believed would follow. We survived that crisis 25 years ago because action plans were developed and followed.

If the governor has visited your club, or if you have received emails from Lions Clubs International, or if you read the monthly newsletter, you have heard about a crisis impacting our clubs. You may have seen it firsthand at your last fundraiser or last service project. You need another set of hands in service, or someone else to flip the pancakes, or to sell raffle tickets, or even Christmas trees. This crisis is in membership retention and membership recruitment. This crisis can be solved, as was Y2K, by the implementation of action plans by our clubs.

It is time for an action plan with a focus on expanding membership and therefore service opportunities for our clubs. All clubs were asked to prepare a membership plan and forward it to the district membership chair. Clubs should ensure that they implement their plan.

One way to retain members and to attract members is to promote the service that our clubs provide for our communities. Our goal statement should be to strengthen community ties, enhance service projects, and increase membership in our Lions clubs by partnering with local community organizations and launching impactful service initiatives that will attract new members and keep existing members happy.

One action step would be to identify local organizations and groups for partnership. You may already be working with some organizations, but you know that there are others that you can, and likely should, be working with to improve our communities.

Who should take the lead? Who should be the responsible party? It could be the chair of the service project, or it could be a membership chair, or a club officer who seeks out a partnership within their community. The leader should work with their team members and community connections to develop and collaborate on a community service project. The team should decide on a date to begin and a date that the project will be completed.

One quick way to start is to host a brainstorming session to define service project ideas. This should begin in the club, but later include your community partners. Meetings can be held in person, virtually, by email, or by phone. Use technology as a tool to assist.

Plan and organize collaborative service events. Execute service events and document outcomes. Celebrate your collaboration with club members and partners. Evaluate the event's impact and membership recruitment outcomes. Have you planted seeds? Did you make your club members happier? Did you gain new members?

Christmas Eve at the Bonura's: An LVRF Fundraiser

January Message from 2nd VDG Leon Cardiff

Our ability today to communicate with others is so far forward from the Lions newsletters that were typed, copied, envelope licking, stamps and trips to the post office. Yes, even in the 90's, it was the telphone, mail, and Word of Mouth as well as meetings by which information was passed onto other Lions. And here we are today. We have a plethora of means to share Lions information, text, email, voice mail, cell phones and yet decide what Lions members should read. Wheher it is pertinent information about their club or other clubs nearby, within the district or from Lions International. Goals attained, achievements, disaster needs locally or nationally are included in these newsletters and emails.

This past summer alone, the monthly newsletters as well as the weekly DG's Secretary's emails with the schedules, activities and fundraisers within were published by emails and these notices assisted clubs in helping to meet the tasks of theirs and fellow clubs in serving others when they were limited on personnel resources.

Club newsletters, DG Susan, 1st VDG Martin and myself look forward to receiving each club's newsletter so we know what, where and why a club is doing service projects, fundraisers or celebrations so we and others can take part and help. We still DO NOT GET a newsletter from every club in the district. Some of you DO a flier to be shared in the monthly newsletter with your upcoming events or activities, don't stop. Thank you, I get a lot of information from these fliers and it helps with looking at my calendar's open dates (does not help with snop but..) on taking part in helping.

I will put my head in the guillotine here. Each newsletter takes at least an hour to put together information to share. So Lions will READ what has happened, events coming up or specific information to ponder or share. After talking with several club newsletter creators, even after they publish and distribute, they still get calls as to what is going on or coming up within their own club. And yet, the editors may not verbalize but the thought is: Did you read the newsletter I sent out 3 days ago or last week?

Another point is that DG Susan, 1st VDG Martin and myself do not put forth a message each month in the monthly newsletter. It is NOT a one-way message in which we put forth points and then retire to the next visitation, meeting or zoom. It is a two-way street. WE WANT TO HEAR your feedback about the items we convey which are important to all that make up the Pride of our district. Otherwise, we have no idea if you as a Lion or your club's perspectives of the information put forth needs more discussion or clarification. Otherwise, we are standing in a field of corn with the ears of the corn and stalks slightly swaying from the breeze of information put forth and yet not knowing what the crop may need to sustain growth and flourish.

Clubs do reach milestones, celebration of a Charter Night that they wish to celebrate not just within their own club but with other Lions of District 22W that they have served alongside. The newsletters provide this while also providing information on clubs' needs for medical equipment, conveyance of spirtual thoughts for members or their families whose health conditions are impacting their lives. And yes, the notice and observance of a Lion who has passed on that may be known to members of your club.

January Message from SVDG Leon Cardiff Continued:

Without sharing, many of you and your members may not realize, even if they are not going to the multiple district convention at the WISP in western, Maryland in May, very important items will be voted on that affects each member of your club, the district and the mutiple district. These will be shared in the upcoming monthly newsletters but here are just two.

The first is being possibly able to Electronically Vote for district officers, amendments/changes to By-Laws, District Constitutions or Multi-District Foundations by **NOT BEING PRESENT OR ATTENDING** the Multiple District Convention. Without sharing, your club members do not know and as such can not put forth their perspective or opinions and reasons to vote for these measures in May. The second voting item being a Resolution for changes to the LVRF Constitution and By-Laws.

Sharing the knowledge of your club's service projects, activities, events, needs and happenings as well as other clubs in your zone, region AND the district embodies the fact "We Serve". Likely without the newsletter, members do not know if another club needs volunteers, possibly the need of someone in your club that has unique abilities, contacts or training, a Lion or non-Lion you know to help complete a project or repair a piece of equipment for another club. The newsletters are the Bulletin Board for the 49 clubs of the district without having to use a thumb tack to pin a post card with the information that many may not see at a local brick and mortar establishment.

As you can surmise now, by rereading the first paragraph, having all the missing letters would give you the complete words, making more thorough sentences and providing information for you as an individual to decipher whether the substance of that paragraph's content was useful or helpful to you as a Lion. Read and share both your club's newsletter as well as the Cabinet Secretary's weekly email and the monthly newsletter which contains a very comprehensive snapshot of our district both past present and future.

This poster represents the theme "Peace WIthout Limits" by showing an appearing "limitless' display of peace, despite what lies on the opposite side of the curtain, with diverse people holding hands to the succession of human-made landmarks, and every incorporation of united life inbetween. Peace appears to run abundant and eternal on this side of the curtain. However, on the left side, of which the boy appears to be 'coming from', war is imminent. With fires, destroyed buildings, battle, and death, this side depicts the depression and loss which is projected from war. Between having the 'graves' of religion side by side, a grieving mother, and a starving dog, the feeling of hopelessness is looming over the whole scene. A smaller detail of modern incorporation of war is that of the 'curtain cloth of countries' having the flags of countries that are currently in or suffering the effects of war facing that side, and being scathed in the crossfire. By having a mere child be the one who "pulls back the curtain", this art shows how not even the most young and innocent are spared from war and hate, while paradoxically showing that they can make the biggest difference of all.

Melvin Jones, born on January 13, 1879, in Fort Thomas, Arizona, was the son of a United States Army captain. The Leos will be receiving a t-shirt in the new year. They have to achieve three meetings and/or service projects in order to receive their t-shirt.




Liberty High & Century **High Leo** Clubs


Thursday, May 1st - The convention begins with a shotgun start golf tournament at Lodestone at 1 p.m.
