On February 11-13, 2025, Lions International held Day 1-3 of the FVDG/DGE Seminar at the Q Center in St. Charles. The Q Center is designed to train a large number of people in a controlled environment. Over seven hundred Lions who will become governor in July 2025, were grouped in thirty-one classrooms with Lions who spoke the same language and with a team leader. All reviewed these topics: Lions fundamentals, becoming a whole leader, managing a team, membership growth strategies, Lions Clubs International Foundation, action planning, and leading change. At the 107th Lions International Convention, we will receive Day 4 of the 2025 FVDG/DGE Seminar in Orlando, Florida. Before then, we have a Multiple District 22 training course on February 28th and March 1st.

Lions International provides the training and resources needed to allow the sitting district governor to administer the district and the clubs for success. The journey to becoming a district governor involves the desire to serve our club, the other clubs in our district and multiple district, and the organization as a whole.

The Emerging Lions Leadership Institute (ELLI) is scheduled for March 14–16, 2025 for Lion Leaders of Maryland, Delaware, & Washington D.C. Anyone, including Lions and Leos, interested in learning more about Lionism should join us at Lions Camp Merrick in Nanjemoy, Maryland. This retreat offers a unique opportunity to develop leadership skills, deepen your understanding of Lionism and build lasting



connections with service-minded individuals from across our districts.

March Message from SVDG Leon Cardiff –

Budgets, activities, fundraising, donations, requests for support and it all leads to basic numbers. Something every club, board, treasurer and president face each year. The ebb and flow varies on the inbound funds from activities as well as fundraiser each year. Rain, competing events, turn out, economics of those who can afford partaking let alone the increase in product cost faced and not raising our prices.



The ornery budget and projections from previous years are reviewed and asked of a committee chair or the group on a yearly basis. What are we committed to with the flat amount and which line item do we have flexibility in giving?

The Board members are seasoned enough realizing that while there may not be a line in the activities budget for those unforeseen requests it gets handled. Some clubs are fortunate on several fundraisers that balance or do very well while others are limited on events due to locality, the demographics and core membership participation. Yes, all our clubs' members are getting older.

This year's District Governors' Challenges, as every year have seen an ebb and flow. Support for "Heavenly Peace" was greater than expected and may have been that coffers were positive based on activities and fundraisers from the spring and summer.

The third DG Challenge for donation of funds for the building of two pantries for the community in Pensacola, North Carolina has been a different economic process for all of our clubs within the district. Normally, DG challenges in meeting perceived achievements take place over several months. Yet the completion of the pantries fortunately has shifted due to weather conditions for the volunteers completing their area of expertise. This has ranged from the high school students building the base floors and walls, to other businesses fitting in their special piece for a completed product.

As of now, the first pantry will have been completed. These buildings are different in their need of insulation for use as a refrigerated cold unit or that of non-perishable goods in meeting the codes for both Maryland and North Carolina. The second pantry building, weather cooperating, should be completed in two weeks.

We have so far received about one third of the amount for the materials for both pantries. I understand that NO club budgeted in their Activities or Administrative accounts for this challenge. No funds will be dispersed from the District 22W Foundation for this challenge until receipts are provided to DG Susan Cox, 1VDG Martin Bonura, CT Guy Garey and CS Wendy Drum.

Thank you to those Lions clubs and Lions members which have already donated to this challenge.

"We Serve"



Since our third Cabinet Meeting, more information is known for our Third VDG Service Challenge for the period of January 11, 2025 to March 29, 2025. The focus of this challenge is to assist those impacted by Hurricane Helene in Pensacola, North Carolina, population of approximately 500, through the construction of two small food pantries. The pantries, one for nonperishable items and one for perishables with refrigeration, will replace the current use of a tractor-trailer for food storage, offering a more effective solution for the community's needs. The Tiny Home Relief Project (THRP), located in Oakland, MD, is leading the effort with the help of volunteer labor from local businesses, contractors, and community organizations. The estimated cost for both pantries is \$9,700, which includes materials, fuel and incidental travel expenses for transporting the pantries from Oakland, Maryland. The pantries will serve as an important resource for the community. All donations will be managed by the District 22W Foundation, with Treasurer Guy Garey overseeing funds. Clubs should notify AA Neal Roop of their participation, as he is tracking contributions for awards.

Diabetic and Family Camp

Family Camp: Wednesday June 25 through Saturday June 28 Week 1: Sunday June 29 through Friday July 4 Week 2/Buddy Week: Sunday July 6 through Friday July 11

Family Camp: 6/25 - 28, 2025

Diabetic camp is specifically designed for campers between the age of 6-16 who have been diagnosed with type 1 or 2 diabetes.

Aligned with diabetic camp, family camp is a time for campers and their families (ages 5 and over) to experience camp while still having their families close by.

Campers will enjoy meeting new peers, learning about their diabetes or their sibling's diabetes, canoeing, exploring the ropes course, learning how to shoot a bow, using the blow-up water and slip 'n slide, and learning how to be independent.

The skills taught at camp aim to empower campers and foster independence.

Adults will be meeting with other adults and pharmaceutical companies. They will network to learn more about their children's diabetes, how they can best help and empower their children, and how they can work towards their children to be more independent.

A typical week breakdown of the two camps for Diabetics is as follows:

Week 1: 6/29 - 7/4, 2025

This week is just for our diabetic campers! During this week, they can connect and learn alongside other children with diabetes, all while having fun and empowering themselves.

Campers will be hiking, canoeing, shooting archery, using the high and low ropes course, playing on the blow-up waterslide and slip 'n slide, and many other activities.

Week 2: 7/6 - 11, 2025

This week is our sibling's week. During this week, our diabetic campers can bring a sibling with them to camp. Campers will have the same experiences as our week 1 camper with the bonus of having a sibling there learning about their diabetes. Siblings will have the opportunity to learn about diabetes and how they can help care for and help their siblings.

22-W Mobile Screening Unit

The Mobile Screening Unit for 22-W has arrived. At this point it is parked in a warehouse in Williamsport awaiting design and application of the wrap (outer decoration). This hopefully will be completed in the next few weeks.

The steering committing is in the process of preparing documentation concerning policies and procedures for usage, scheduling, and methods of transporting the van.

One of our first tasks is to recruit what we are calling "designated" drivers. Our plan is that each region will identify a small number (3 or 4) of qualified drivers who are willing to volunteer to help the clubs in their region with transportation of the van to their scheduled event.

Driver duties would be:

After event has been scheduled, coordinate with sponsoring club(s) about pickup and return date and times, address of event, parking spot requirements at event site and power source requirements.

- Pick up the van from its current place of storage
- Transport and park vehicle at confirmed parking spot
- Place wheel chocks at rear tires
- Attach steps to van (as needed)
- Identify location of power source
- Run cables to power source and plug-in
- Power on generator (if needed)
- Educate club members on setup as needed
- Return the van to storage with a full tank of gas. Receipts for gas will be submitted to club and driver will be reimbursed for gas, parking fees and tolls as necessary

Requirements are:

- Current Maryland (or equivalent adjacent state) class A, B or C driver's license
- Clean driving record, no moving violations
- Experience driving large vehicles such as:
 - 1. Type "B", "C" or "D" school bus
 - 2. Class "A" motor home or class "C" motor home over 25 feet long
 - 3 Single rear axle straight truck with a body length of 18 feet or more
- Physical ability to assist in setting up the MSU at designated location to include:
- Chocking wheels, placing exterior steps, etc.
- Assist in erecting "EZ Up" style tent and placing tables and chairs

Knowledge/ability to inspect vehicle before use:

- Checking vehicle and under-body generator oil levels and adjust as necessary
- Checking tire pressure
- Checking vehicle lights
- Cleaning windows as necessary

Training sessions will be provided and EACH DRIVER MUST ATTEND A TRAINING SESSION BEFORE THEIR FIRST TRIP

A copy of driver's license will be sent to the insurance company.

No driver shall operate the van when impaired by drugs or alcohol.

Additionally, each proposed amendment requires approval by at least two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast to be adopted.

The Board of Trustees of the Lions Vision Research Foundation has voted to approve four resolutions amending the foundation's bylaws and requests that the Delegates to the Multiple District 22 Convention consider and vote on these changes.

Proposed Resolutions: Resolution 1

Article | Section 1

Article I Section 1 currently: "The name of the project shall be MULTIPLE DISTRICT 22 LIONS VISION RESEARCH FOUNDATION, INC."

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article I Section 1 be changed to read:

Article I Section 1: "The name of the organization shall be MULTIPLE DISTRICT 22 LIONS VISION RESEARCH FOUNDATION, INC."

Resolution 2

Article | Section 2

Article I Section 2 currently: "The purposes of this organization are to advance Lionism within the Multiple District in accordance with the objects of Lions Clubs International, to bring greater strength to the Lions Clubs in the Multiple District through unity of effort and to provide proper administration."

Article I Section 2: "The purpose of the Multiple District 22 Lions Vision Research Foundation (LVRF) is to strengthen its partnership with The Johns Hopkins Wilmer Eye Institute and the continued focus on the provision of clinical low vision eye care to patients, the training of multidisciplinary low vision practitioners to serve individuals in need, and research the foundational causes and rehabilitation strategies, including educational methods and technology for those negatively impacted by vision loss."

Resolution 3

Article II Section 1 C

Article II Section 1 C currently: "Each Sub-District, at a meeting of the District Governor and the Honorary Committee, shall elect each year prior to the Multiple District Convention, one (1) new member to replace the retiring member from said Board. This new member shall serve for a period of three years except for the first year (1988) when each Sub-District shall elect three (3) members, one to serve three (3) years, one to serve two (2) years and one to serve one (1) year."

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article II Section 1 C changed to read:

Article II Section 1 C: "Each Sub-District, using the procedures set forth in that Sub-District's own Constitution & By-Laws, shall elect each year prior to the Multiple District Convention, one (1) new trustee to replace the retiring Trustee from said Board. This new trustee shall serve for a period of three years. The election of said Board trustee shall be communicated to the LVRF chairperson no later than the Multiple District Convention and begin their duties beginning July 1st of the recognized Lions new fiscal year."

Article II Section 4 currently: "The notice of special meetings shall be in writing, shall state the purpose or purposes for which the meeting is called, and shall give the date, the time and the place of meeting and shall comply with Section 4 above."

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article II Section 4 changed to read:

Article II Section 4: "The notice of special meetings shall be in writing or electronically, shall state the purpose or purposes for which the meeting is called, and shall give the date, the time and the place of meeting and shall comply with Section 4 and Section 5."
