#### A Season of Renewal



## A Message from FVDG Martin Bonura:

Recruiting, Retention, and New Club Development Through Service

As Lions, we have been challenged to help our organization reach 1.5 million Lion members by the July 2027 Lions Clubs International convention to be held in Washington, D.C. To accomplish this, we need to retain the Lions we currently have and add to that number by recruiting new members and creating new clubs in underserved areas. You, as club members, have been offered this challenge, but how is this to be accomplished?



The latest Lions International magazine includes an article entitled, "Step Right Up – Service Carnivals Give Families a Day of Fun, Fellowship, and Free Services." The article written by Madelein Miller, with photos by Dewin Lam, describes a Malaysian project that provides a creative and attention-grabbing way to show non-Lions what we can accomplish. It is a hand-on way to retain Lions by getting involved with a gratifying service project, recruit new members for their club, and help the district with the creation of a new club in the underserved community.

On May 10th at the Urbana Library in Frederick, Maryland, we will hold a Service Carnival that will allow the public to know more about Lions because it provides interaction between our Lions and the community. The carnival will present the clubs of Frederick conducting service and community service organizations demonstrating the service they provide to the community.

We have identified the Urbana Library as the location. We have reserved the large room and are working on securing the plaza outside of the library. We have a radio station interested in being there live with music. Frederick clubs have suggested service projects that they will host at the carnival and we are seeking other non-profits and potential medical professionals to conduct screenings. Our diabetes committee is securing awareness documents and a professional to do testing.

A team consisting of DG Susan, FVDG Martin, SVDG Leon, CC Evan, GST Bonnie, and CS Wendy are the driving force behind this project. The team is working on plans - securing the library, the radio station, clubs, and medical professionals. We will expand the team to include the Lions interested in making this service carnival a success and those interested in expanding it into other areas.





## Did You Know?

Diabetes is the leading cause of new cases of blindness in adults aged 18-64 years.

Anyone with diabetes is at risk for diabetes-related eye diseases such as diabetic retinopathy, macular edema, glaucoma, and cataracts.

Diabetic retinopathy is the most common diabetic eye disease and a leading cause of blindness in American adults. The number of individuals with diabetic retinopathy is predicted to increase by nearly 50% (It's actually 47.7%) to over 11 million people by 2030.

In early stages, diabetic retinopathy may not have any obvious signs or symptoms, but finding it early can help protect your vision. Regular eye exams is the key to avoiding low vision and blindness from diabetic retinopathy.

## District 22-W Mobile Screening Unit

## **Submitted by Lion Bob Johnson**

## Coming soon to an event near you!

The idea of obtaining a Mobile Heath Screening Unit (MSU) for District 22-W originated in the mind of then 2nd Vice District Governor Brian Cox in the late summer of 2014. An informal exploratory committee was formed at that time and a number of health screening units being used in other Lions regions and districts were looked at. The concept progressed to an initial design concept and preliminary pricing was identified. By the middle of 2015, the group in a position to "sell" the concept the District 22-W Board.

Once the project was approved it was necessary to form a 501c3 foundation within District 22-W to accept tax deductible donations and to own the unit when it was completed. During the same period the now official MSU committee refined the design of the MU, identified a vendor, and worked with the vendor to obtain firm pricing. At that time the quoted price of the MSU (upfitted vehicle less testing and support equipment) was approximately

\$140,000 subject to periodic price adjustments driven by the actual order placement date. Fifty percent of the total cost, up to a limit of \$100,000, would be covered by a matching grant from LCIF.

With a financial objective in sight fundraising for the MSU was started during the 2016 – 2017 Lions year with the hope that the unit could be ordered before the end of 2020. Good fundraising progress was being made when something called COVID-19 brought fundraising efforts to a sudden halt and serious fundraising efforts did not resume until 2022. During the interim, a number of things happened to impact the project. First, the body builder that had provided the original pricing to our dealer went out of business. A new body builder was identified and the pricing updated (at a significantly higher price point).

Before we could finalize our fundraising efforts, the second body builder decided to exit the bus body segment of the body builder industry so our local vendor had to identify a third upfitter to build the MSU body (with yet another price increase). Fortunately, during this period, several very generous donations were received which, coupled with regular on-going donations, allowed us to finally place the order for the MSU in the spring of 2024. To place things in perspective, between the time the original price quote was received in late 2016 and the time the order was placed in 2024 the price for the MSU vehicle (less equipment) the cost of the unit increased to \$216,000 which is a 50% increase.

After many years, the loss of two body builders, and one pandemic, the District 22-W Foundation took delivery of the MSU on December 5th of 2024. We are now in the process of finalizing policies and procedures in the areas of the actual health testing activities and client notification; user club scheduling; usage records keeping; and vehicle transport and maintenance. We are also in the process of applying for a separate LCIF grant to help cover the cost of medical testing equipment. Other current activities include designing and installing a vehicle wrap (graphics package); obtaining support equipment such as exterior lighting, registration table and tent, vehicle on site safety equipment (exterior access steps wheel chocks, client traffic management equipment; etc.).

Current plans for the unit to be stored, when not in use, somewhere in Region III (Washington County) since it is a central location. We currently have temporary parking for the unit near Williamsport and are working on identifying a permanent location. Due to the size of the MSU we will have dedicated drivers to transport it to user locations. We plan on having a minimum of two qualified drivers in each region and are making good progress on identifying them. Individual clubs who have scheduled the MSU for an event will be responsible for coordinating with the dedicated drivers.

If all goes well, we hope to have the MSU ready for initial service by early summer of this year. More details will be provided as information becomes available. The MSU committee would like to thank all of the individuals, clubs and other organizations who have made donations in support of the MSU. Hope you checked it out at the 4<sup>th</sup> Cabinet Meeting!

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article I Section 1 be changed to read:

Article I Section 1: "The name of the organization shall be MULTIPLE DISTRICT 22 LIONS VISION RESEARCH FOUNDATION, INC."

#### Resolution 2

#### Article | Section 2

Article I Section 2 currently: "The purposes of this organization are to advance Lionism within the Multiple District in accordance with the objects of Lions Clubs International, to bring greater strength to the Lions Clubs in the Multiple District through unity of effort and to provide proper administration."

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article I Section 2 be changed to read:

Article I Section 2: "The purpose of the Multiple District 22 Lions Vision Research Foundation (LVRF) is to strengthen its partnership with The Johns Hopkins Wilmer Eye Institute and the continued focus on the provision of clinical low vision eye care to patients, the training of multidisciplinary low vision practitioners to serve individuals in need, and research the foundational causes and rehabilitation strategies, including educational methods and technology for those negatively impacted by vision loss."

#### Resolution 3

#### Article II Section 1 C

Article II Section 1 C currently: "Each Sub-District, at a meeting of the District Governor and the Honorary Committee, shall elect each year prior to the Multiple District Convention, one (1) new member to replace the retiring member from said Board. This new member shall serve for a period of three years except for the first year (1988) when each Sub-District shall elect three (3) members, one to serve three (3) years, one to serve two (2) years and one to serve one (1) year."

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article II Section 1 C changed to read:

Article II Section 1 C: "Each Sub-District, using the procedures set forth in that Sub-District's own Constitution & By-Laws, shall elect each year prior to the Multiple District Convention, one (1) new trustee to replace the retiring Trustee from said Board. This new trustee shall serve for a period of three years. The election of said Board trustee shall be communicated to the LVRF chairperson no later than the Multiple District Convention and begin their duties beginning July 1st of the recognized Lions new fiscal year."

#### Resolution 4

Article II Section 4

Article II Section 4 currently: "The notice of special meetings shall be in writing, shall state the purpose or purposes for which the meeting is called, and shall give the date, the time and the place of meeting and shall comply with Section 4 above."

BE IT RESOLVED, that Article II Section 4 changed to read:

Article II Section 4: "The notice of special meetings shall be in writing or electronically, shall state the purpose or purposes for which the meeting is called, and shall give the date, the time and the place of meeting and shall comply with Section 4 and Section 5."


